

India jumps to 3rd global ranking in scientific publications: Dr Jitendra

NEW DELHI: India has jumped from 7th to 3rd global ranking in scientific publications. This was disclosed here on Sunday by Union Minister, Dr Jitendra Singh while addressing the media in the presence of Union Secretary Department of Science & Technology (DST) Dr S. Chandrasekhar.

Lauding the consistent efforts of India's scientific fraternity, Dr Jitendra gave all credit to an enabling milieu and freedom of working provided by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. He said, the very fact that such quantum leaps in our scientific pursuits are happening only in the last few years is a testimony to the push given by PM Modi both in terms of the ease of policy as well as his personal indulgence and prioritisation.

Dr Jitendra informed that as per the National Science Foundation (NSF)'s Science & Engineering Indicators 2022 report of the United

States, India's position globally in scientific publications, has improved from 7th position in 2010 to 3rd position in 2020. He also added that India's scholarly output increased from 60,555 papers in 2010 to 1,49,213 papers in 2020.

Dr Jitendra Singh said, this became possible only because of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who not only has a natural predilection for science but is also forthcoming in supporting and promoting science and technology based initiatives and projects in the last 8 years. He said, India's

scientific prowess is going to have a major role in the making of "AtmaNirbhar Bharat".

Dr Jitendra Singh said, India's research performance in science and technology has improved significantly over the past few years which is visible through large amount of scientific knowledge in terms of research publications, development of technologies and innovations contributing to overall development.

Dr Jitendra Singh also took pride that India now ranks 3rd in terms of number of

PhDs in science and engineering. He was also apprised of the fact that the number of patents granted to Indian scientists at India Patent Office (IPO) during the last three years has also increased from 2511 in 2018-19 to 4003 in 2019-20 and 5629 in 2020-21.

The National Science Foundation is an independent agency of the United States government that supports fundamental research and education in all the non-medical fields of science and engineering.

It may be recalled that as per the Global Innovation Index (GII) 2022 brought out by World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO), India's GII ranking has also improved significantly from 81st in 2014 to 40th position in 2022.


Dr Jitendra Singh said, the government has taken several steps to boost the science and technology sector which includes successive increase in allocations for Scientific

Departments, incentivizing investment by private sector to increase their share in GIRD, improving the ease of doing business in the Science, Technology and Innovation (STI) activities; introducing flexible tools for public procurement; creating avenues for collaborative STI funding through portfolio-based funding mechanisms such as Public-Private-Partnerships and other innovative hybrid funding mechanisms.

A senior official informed that the Department of Science and Technology is likely to get 20 percent more money in the upcoming Union Budget 2023-24 to around Rs 7,930 Crore including funds for National Research Foundation.

In the last budget, DST was given Rs 6,002 Crore, which was 42 percent of the total fund of Rs 14,217 Crore allocated to the Ministry of Science and Technology. DSIR received Rs 5,636 Crore (40%), while DBT got Rs 2,581 Crore (18%).

DSS demands early revival of Dogra monuments, Heritage

JAMMU: Th Gulchand Singh Charak, President Dogra Sadar Sabha (DSS) J&K and former minister chaired a review meeting of Central Working Committee (CWC) of DSS wherein roadmap for follow up action on agenda of previous meetings was discussed in detail. It was also resolved to place unsettled issues before the LG Manoj Sinha and other concerned for immediate redressal. The participants reiterated major demands of DSS to immediately restore Mubarak Mandi complex to its pristine glory and not to shift the soul of Mubarak Mandi complex, that is the archives, worth hundreds of crores of rupees artifacts, to Kala Kendra or any other place outside the complex as that would render the monument 'soul-less and attraction-less' for the students, tourists and lovers of heritage and history. Proposed conversion of Maharani Charaki Palace into a hotel was also decried on technical grounds being against the standard norms of heritage. Immediate strengthening of embankments and other conservation measures on the circular roadside of Mubarak Mandi hillock were stressed

to prevent sliding and collapse of the priceless structure. Simultaneously, the need to meticulously connect Mahamaya Hillock to Jawant Cave Cable Car Project with Mubarak Mandi Heritage complex was stressed once again for convenience of the visitors, particularly for the tourists from outside the Union Territory.

Demand for the facelift of the 118 year old DSS Bhawan under Smart City Project was also raised with one voice. It was noted with satisfaction that there was a proposal to hand over management of Balidan Stambh at Jammu to the Army. Satisfaction was also expressed over abandoning the extravagant practice of Darbar move and functioning of the secretariat at both capital cities of the UT, the members of the secretariat at both

Participants suggested befitting Memorial of the Martyrs at Akhnoor and Planwala also and requested officials to show due honour to ex-servicemen and their families. Percentage reservation for border area residents was desired to be appropriately raised.

The members also sought removing restrictions on passing of general public through General N C Vij Road along front of Civil Secretariat, Jammu was stressed to conveniently connect monuments, heritage buildings and places of interest for visitors and public like Gandhi Bhawan, Ranbirsingh Temple, Jambulochan Memorial, Ranbir Public Library, Government College for Women, Zanana Park (park exclusively for women) and several other institutions

and trade and business hubs. Government was urged to declare the Ranbir Canal as the State Heritage to facilitate its regular maintenance and ensure unhindered irrigation to the world renowned traditional basmati rice crop of R S Pura besides other crops.

Lt Gen R K Sharma, Col Dr V K Sali VRC (Retd) and Brig M S Jamwal demanded compensation to war widows. Raj Kumar Thapa and Sangra of Kathua District made a serious case for control of 'monkey menace' that was taking heavy toll of farming in Kandi areas.

The main ones you've probably heard about are "good cholesterol" and "bad cholesterol." Good cholesterol is called high-density lipoprotein (HDL). Your HDLs carry cholesterol to your liver. Your liver keeps your cholesterol levels balanced. It makes enough cholesterol to

support your body's needs and gets rid of the rest. You must have enough HDLs to carry cholesterol to your liver. If your HDLs are too low, you'll have too much cholesterol circulating in your blood. Bad cholesterol is called low-density lipoprotein (LDL). This is the culprit that makes plaque form in your arteries. Having too many LDLs can lead to heart disease over time.

He further added that when to get your cholesterol checked, High cholesterol can start in childhood or adolescence.

That's why current guidelines suggest beginning screenings during childhood. Get your cholesterol checked every five years starting at age nine. A child whose parents have high cholesterol or a history of heart problems may begin even sooner.

For adult males: Get your cholesterol checked every five years until age 45. From age 45 to 65, get checked every one to two years. After age 65, get checked every year. For adult females: Get checked every five years until age 55. From age 55 to 65, get checked every one to two years. After age 65, get checked every year.

Dr Sushil Sharma in his concluding remarks told that people should talk with healthcare provider about the best way to lower cholesterol. Some people only need some simple lifestyle changes like eating less saturated fat. Others need lifestyle changes plus medication. People with medical conditions that affect their cholesterol may need a more complex approach.

In Champaora Tehsil around 35 kanals of Kaheharai land under survey no. 2521 was also evicted from land mafia in Estate Nowgama area under the supervision of Tehsildar Saleem.

The DC sought cooperation of the general public in its action against encroachments and also warned of action under CrPC in matters of encroachment on State/kahcharai lands.
