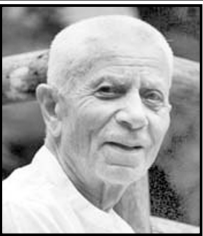

CRIME REPORT

Minor girl kidnapped from Samba found in Pune

JAMMU: A minor girl allegedly kidnapped last month from Jammu and Kashmir's Samba district was found in Pune and her abductor arrested, police said on Wednesday.

The girl had gone missing on November 16. When she did not return from school, her family members launched a search for her but the girl could not be traced. Her father the lodged a complaint at Bari Brahmana police station, they said.

During the investigation, it was discovered that the girl had been kidnapped by an unidentified person and a kidnapping case registered.

Finally, she was recovered from Pune in Maharashtra and the kidnapper -- Mahendra Nishad of Bilaspur in Chhattisgarh -- arrested, they said.

After completing all legal formalities, the girl was reunited with her parents, they said and added that further investigation was underway.

Man injured in blast near Army's firing range in Rajouri

RAJOURI/JAMMU: A man was injured in a blast near the Army's firing practice range in Jammu and Kashmir's Rajouri district on Wednesday, officials said.

Harbansh Singh, a resident of Nonial village of Nowshera subdivision, was reportedly present near the practice range in Garhi when the explosion took place, police said.

He is under treatment at a hospital, they said, adding an investigation has been set in motion.

Snatching case of Sidhra Highway solved; 3 accused arrested

JAMMU: Police on Wednesday solved snatching case of Sidhra Highway by arresting three accused.

As per the details, a complaint was lodged at Police Station Bagh e Bahu by one person namely Sahil Sharma, son of Late Vijay Kumar, resident of Panjigrai, Tehsil Nagrota District Jammu regarding snatching case. In this regard, FIR No. 122/2022 under sections 341/382/427 IPC & 4/25 Arms Act was registered at Police Station Bagh-e-Bahu and investigation started.

After this, a team of Police Station Bagh e Bahu under the supervision of SDPO East Syed Zaheer Abbas Jafari led by SHO Bagh-e-Bahu Insp Sikander Singh did strenuous efforts which include meticulous analysis of CCTV footages, rounding up of suspects, collection and analysis of technical data. Finally police teams zeroed three suspects namely Talib Hussain, son of Late Faquir Mohd, resident of Upper Ragoora Teh. & Distt Jammu; Zahoor Ali, son of Noor Hussain, resident of Upper Ragoora Teh. & Distt Jammu and Liaquat Ali, son of Shukr Din, resident of Shahbad colony Bagh-e-Bahu Teh. Bahu Distt Jammu from different locations.

During sustained questioning they confessed their involvement in the above case. The Vehicle used for commission of crime bearing reg no. JK02 AE/1910 Maruti 800 has also been seized.

Further investigations to unearth his linkages with other theft/snatching cases of NHW 44 area is going on and more arrests and recoveries are expected soon.

4 vehicles involved in illegal mining seized

JAMMU: In a quest to stem the menace of illegal mining, a multi-pronged strategy was devised by Jammu Police in which teams of Police Stations Domana, R.S. vehicles involved in illegal mining. The seized vehicles include one tractor trolley without registration no seized by Domana Police; one tractor trolley bearing Chasis No. 2NH6010BA, by R.S Pura Police; one tractor trolley bearing Chasis No. MBNAAAL2BLJG00771 by Phallian Mandal Police; one tractor bearing Chassis No MGNGAALUPLRF01625, by Sandwan Police.

The recoveries were made by SHO R.S Pura Insp Pawan Kumar; SHO Domana Insp Tilak Raj, In-Charge Police Post Phallian Mandal PSI Ajesh Singh Janwal and In-Charge Border Police Post Sandwan ASI Jang Bhadur Singh their respective jurisdiction.

9 bovines rescued, two smugglers arrested

JAMMU: Acting tough against the bovine smugglers and to curb the bovine smuggling menace, Jammu Police has rescued 9 bovines during Naka checking at Tawi Bridge from a vehicle (JK02AP-9107). In this regard, FIR No.428/2022 under section 188/IPC 11PCA, 50,54,56 transport of animal rules was registered at Police Station Nagrota.

The recoveries were made by SHO Nagrota Insp Vishav Partap Singh assisted by In-Charge Police Post Sidhra PSI Nitish Khajuria under the overall supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pradeep. Two accused were arrested and have been identified as Nazir Ahmed, son of Mohd Munshi, resident of Gole Gajral and Mukesh Kumar, son of Darshan Kumar, resident of Miran Sahib Jammu.

Three injured in bear attack in Rajouri

RAJOURI: Three men were injured, two of them critical, when a wild bear attacked them in Rajouri district on Wednesday, officials said.

The incident took place in far flung Kotcharwal village.

Two of the injured have been referred to Government Medical College (GMC) at Jammu in critical condition, they said.

As per locals of the area, the victims were in their fields when a wild bear appeared from nearby bushes and attacked them.

The injured have been identified as Mohd Munshi (55), Buttu (35) and Abdul Rashid (30) - all resident of Kotcharwal.

Police stop family of six from crossing over to PoK

POONCH: Six members of a family, including women and children, left their home in Mendhar area of Poonch district on Tuesday morning and drove towards Chakkan Da Bagh near Line of Control (LoC) to cross over to PoK.

The family, however, were apprehended by the police enroute near Chakkan Da Bagh and taken to Poonch police station. The police have taken cognisance of the matter and requested the Poonch district magistrate to initiate appropriate action.

Those apprehended included 36-year-old Zafar Iqbal, his mother Karamat Bi (60), his two sisters-in-law Zahleen Kousar (34) and Zanib Kousar (30), besides two nephews, Naseeb Khan (12), and Arbaz Khan (10). "Zafar drove the family from Gohlad village in Mendhar in an ECHO vehicle belonging to his uncle," police said.

"We were upset with some local revenue officials for delaying the partition of our property, despite court orders," Zafar Iqbal told the police. He said Assistant Commissioner,

Revenue, Poonch, had in 2021 ordered partition of the property between him and his uncles. "But, using their clout, my uncles managed to influence the local officials to halt the process," he added. Iqbal admitted that crossing over to PoK would not have solved their problems. "We took the extreme step out of frustration, we don't even have relatives living across the LoC".

Woman found dead mysteriously in Rajouri village, probe launched

RAJOURI: A woman was found dead under mysterious conditions in-front of her house on the intervening night of Tuesday and Wednesday in Gundha village of Rajouri district even as police have started investigation.

An official told that woman's body was found in-front of her house with injury marks on her throat.

Ahmed of Gundha village.

He said soon after the incident came to fore, a police reached to the spot and took the body into their possession.

"Further investigation has been into the matter has been initiated," he added.

As he went out of the bank and opened the bag, the entire amount was missing. After receiving the complaint, the police saw the footage of the CCTV installed in the bank and found the vicious person taking money out of the bag. According to the police officer; investigation has been started in the matter and thieves are being searched.

Narco smuggler nabbed with heroin

DODA: Continuing its war against the drug menace under operation "SANJEEVANI", a Party of Police Station Doda while on routine Naka/checking duty near Akramabad on Doda-Bhagwah Road, observed suspicious movement of one person who was coming towards Doda town by foot from Bhagwah side with a bag carried by him.

The police party on getting suspicious about the movement of the said person, intercepted him and on questioning he disclosed his name as Isaq Ahmed son of Shamas Din Khawaja resident of Broom Bhagwah. While conducting his personal search heroin like substance concealed by him in the polythene pouch was recovered from his possession which was being taken by him for selling purpose among the youth.

In this connection, case FIR No.260/2022 under relevant section has been registered at PS Doda and investigation of the case has been set into motion. The forward/backward links of the drug peddler are being ascertained during investigation.

Theft case solved; 2 arrested; stolen items including Royal Enfield bike recovered

arresting 02 thieves and recovered stolen items i.e 01 i-Phone Tab, alongwith 01 Royal Enfield Motorcycle from the offenders who were involved in the offence in the limits of Police Station Hiranagar.

On the complaint of the complainant namely Rakesh Chowdhary; son of Lt. Devi Ditta, resident of Channi Manhasa Vijaypur District Kathua produced a written application at Police Station Hiranagar that during the intervening night of December 10/11,2022 some unknown thief/thieves broke the locks and entered my Royal Enfield Bullet Agency Hiranagar and stole away 01 i-Phone Tab, 01 Royal Enfield Motorcycle alongwith cash amount of Rs. 25000 approximately as well as at the same time unknown persons also broken the locks of 05 more shops for which a case was registered at Police Station Hiranagar in connection with theft vide FIR No. 154/2022 under section 457/380 IPC.

Acting on the tip off, police party led by Insp. Sunil Sharma SHO Hiranagar under the supervision of SDPO Border Panikaj Soodan rounded up several suspects for interrogation and the police team was able to arrest one suspect namely Anil Kumar alias Cobra, son of Romesh Kumar, resident of Badhwal Tehsil Vijaypur District Samba. During sustained questioning, the said person confessed his crime and said team recovered 01 i Phone Tab which he concealed in an Almirah at his residence. Thereafter he disclosed the involvement of another person namely Mohit Singh Sambyal, son of Goverdhan Singh Sambyal, resident of Keli Mandi Samba who was involved with him was also arrested on spot.

Thereafter on their further disclosure 01 Royal Enfield Motorcycle was also recovered from his possession whereas further investigation of the case is going on & Kathua Police is putting all strong efforts to recover remaining stolen property.

Channi Police to grill kingpin of Gandhi Nagar dacoity in Marble market firing case

JAMMU: The custody of Harpreet Singh alias Amit Rana, the main accused involved in the Gandhii Nagar dacoity case, on Wednesday given to Chhannni police by Gandhii Nagar police station. Now Chhannni police will grill Harpreet in FIR No. 175 case in which he fired on police team in the Marble Market area when the police was chasing him.

The rest of the accused arrested in this case are still in Gandhii Nagar Police Station. Only Harpreet's custody has given to Channi Police because he is the only accused in the firing case. Apart from this, the team of Delhi Police is also in Jammu to probe T'S Wazir murder case at own level.

According to the information, a total of four cases have been registered against Harpreet Singh including TS Wazir murder case. Apart from this, there was an old case in Gandhii Nagar police station which involves a case of vehicle theft, but now there are two fresh cases i.e dacoity at house of Rakesh Aggarwal alias Kesha Bania and other Channi firing on the police team, in which a case of attempt to murder has been registered. Gandhii Nagar Police has arrested a total of six accused during their investigation. The weapons have been recovered. Now only the four accused in the Gandhii Nagar case are on run.

Human trafficking case reported; girl from Bangladesh rescued

JAMMU: Another case of human trafficking has come to light in the Jammu city in which Narwal police has recovered a girl which was brought from Bangladesh after giving Rs 20,000. She was being married to an elderly man in Kashmir, but the girl objected and managed to reach back Jammu. Police rescued her from the area.

On the basis of his statements, a case of human trafficking has been registered and further action has been initiated.

According to the information, the Narwal police received an information that a girl has been bought and brought and is currently in the Kiryani Talab area. On this information, police reached the spot and rescued the girl. During statement, girl told an agent named Zafar took twenty thousand rupees from her and brought her Jammu. She was given to Abbas who took her to Kashmir and sold her to man namely Manzoor in Kashmir.

After which the marriage of the girl was being done with an old man which she refused but somehow manage to escape and reached Jammu.
