

Good Governance Week: DC Rajouri presides over public grievance redressal, service delivery camp

RAJOURI: As part of Good Governance Week, Deputy Commissioner, Vikas Kundal on Wednesday presided over a public grievances redressal and service delivery camp at Gurha Top of Rajouri block.

The camp was organised in consonance to the "Sushasan Saptah" (Good Governance Week) being observed from December 19-25, 2022. A series of activities are being carried out in the district to redress the genuine public concerns and also to improve service delivery.

During the event, the locals and their representatives sought dispensary at Fatehpur Gurha Top, installation of handpumps, easing unscheduled power cuts, meeting shortage of electricity poles, additional Anganwadi centres, adequate staff at HS Gurdhambala, completion of pending work on Fatehpur canal, renovation of GPS Dhaba building and construction of Ziarat

to Peepal Mohra road etc.

The officers of different departments also educated the public about their online services and motivated them to avail the benefits of the same. They also responded to the queries raised by the public pertaining to their departments.

The DC gave a patient hearing to the issues projected by the public during the event and assured them that the demands raised shall be fulfilled in a time bound manner.

Speaking at the event, the Deputy Commissioner highlighted the objective of the Good Governance Week and said that it aims to promote citizen-centric governance and improve public service delivery along with redressal of public grievances. He also said that the Government was striving hard to expand the outreach of service delivery mechanisms, making them more effective.

RAMBAN: The aim of the Systematic Voters' Education and Electoral Participation program (SVEEP), is to educate and promote voters literacy among electors and equip them with basic knowledge related to the electoral process, said District Panchayat Election Officer (Deputy Commissioner), Mussarat Islam, said while addressing newly eligible voters in a programme at Ramban.

The DEPO urged upon the people in general and young electors in particular to actively take part in the electoral process to contribute to the development of the country. Meanwhile, the DEPO kick started SVEEP activities in the district to sensitize the people in general and eligible voters in particular to register themselves in the Panchayat Electoral Rolls for which the Panchayat Electoral Rolls revision 2023 is commencing from 21.12.2022.

Referring to Panchayat Electoral Revision which commenced today, the DPEO urged upon the participants to disseminate the information about Panchayat Electoral Revision in their respective areas so that no eligible voter is left out during the revision. In his address, Deputy District Election Officer, Lal Chand informed that the Panchayat Electoral Roll Revision process commenced today (December 21, 2022) with January 1, 2023 as the qualifying date for the registration of new voters. He briefed the participants about the forms including Form PER 2A, PER 2B, PER 2C and PER 2D to be used during the revision. Six special camps shall be organized during the revision period during which the Booth Level Officers (BLOs) shall remain available at the Polling Station locations with requisite Forms for the assistance of PEBOs and guidance of the electors, he informed. Earlier, the students of various schools spoke on the occasion and highlighted the importance of the electoral process. They also presented nukti and skits relating to SVEEP and registration of newly eligible voters during the Panchayat Electoral Roll Revision.

DC Poonch chairs DLRC meeting

POONCH: District Commissioner Poonch, Inder Jeet on Wednesday chaired the District Level Review Committee (DLRC) meeting to review the performance of Banks under Annual Credit Plan (ACP) of FY:2022-23 and Government Sponsored Cases for the July to September Quarter.

JK Bank Lead Bank Office Poonch besides DDM NABARD, Kanav Sharma, General Manager DIC, Dr. Zakir Hussain, Dy. Director Employment, Mohammad Rafiq, Cluster Head JK Bank Poonch, A.K.S. Bagee, Director JK Bank RSETI, Vijay Singh Jasrotia, Regional Manager JKGB, Gagandeep Singh, District Coordinators of all Banks and District Officers of Government Departments attended the meet.

Lead District Manager Poonch, Ashutosh Raj Koul informed the house that under ACP, Banks operating in the District have made total credit disbursement of Rs. 372.64 Cr. against an annual target of Rs. 710.46 Cr registering the achievement of 52%. Out of these Rs.162.42 Cr have been disbursed in Priority Sector against annual target of Rs. 560.64 achieving 29% of target, besides Rs. 210.21 Cr in Non-priority sector against annual target of Rs. 149.81 Cr thereby achieving 140% of the target.

It was also informed to the house that the total deposits & advances in the District were at Rs.3301.69 Cr & Rs.1727.39 Cr

as on 30.09.2022 against Rs. 3272.78 Cr & Rs. 1466.46 Cr against the corresponding period of last year thus showing a growth of 0.88% & 17.79% YOY respectively in both the segments (Rs. 28.91 Cr & Rs. 260.93 Cr).

The CD Ratio of the District as on 30.09.2022 stood at 52.32% which was at 44.81% on 30.09.2021 showing a growth of 14.35% YOY.

In addition to this an amount of Rs. 15.52 Cr was disbursed amongst 443 beneficiaries under various Self Employment Schemes thus providing employment to 1505 unemployed youth till 2nd Quarter of FY (2022-23).

Chairman DLRC impressed upon all the stakeholders to create an enabling environment, where youth can think beyond Government Jobs and for this to happen avenues for gainful self employment have to be strengthened.

Since employment generation is a major challenge, Chairman DLRC further advised all the participants to go an extra mile and show empathy towards the unemployed youth in guiding them towards the path of prosperity and self-sufficiency through various credit facilities tailored in accordance to their entrepreneurial aspirations.

Chairman DLRC directed all the stakeholders to improve performance under priority sector lending so that results are visible on ground.
