steps to address their issues," he said. Sinha said all deserving employees have been promoted, fulfilling their long-pending demand. "The list for promotion from non-gazetted to gazetted posts was forwarded to the Public Service Commission which informed that they were appointed in 2015, while they have already cleared the list of general category employees till 2014 and their list is in pipeline," he said. Sinha said there is only one genuine issue of concern which is of their accommodation.

"Earlier, there were some issues related to land but it was cleared and tenders floated- to complete the project for their accommodation at secured places. As many as 1,200 of them will be provided accommodation by April, and 1,800 more flats will be given during the next financial year," he said.

He said their security is the priority of the administration. "We have cleared their (protesting employees') salaries till August 31, but it cannot be done that they will be paid their salaries by sitting at their homes. This is a loud and clear message to them and they should listen and understand it," he said. He said the J & K administration has full sympathy with them and is ready to provide them security or any other assistance. Referring to the protesting reserved category employees who are also camping in Jammu and demanding their relocation, he said, "They should also keep in mind that they are Kashmir division employees and cannot be transferred to Jammu." However, he said the chief secretary has framed a committee to look into their demand. "And I assure them that if there is any chance, we will frame a policy accordingly."

farmers are taken," Sinha said. He said he is confident that a new revolution in the agriculture and allied sectors is on the anvil. "The agricultural output which stands at Rs 37,600 crore shall increase by over Rs 28,142 crore to reach more than Rs 65,700 crore per year; with a resultant increment in sectoral growth rate to 11 per cent," he said. Sinha said the interventions shall create employment opportunities for over 2.8 lakh youths and establish around 19,000 enterprises. On the Aspirational Panchayat Development Programme, Sinha said Jammu and Kashmir is going to select the most backward 285 panchayats -- one panchayat in each block -- for their holistic development. "An array of key parameters for the preparation of Panchayat Development Index to rate the various panchayats of the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir on socio-economic indicators concerning the lives of the people residing in the rural areas has already been identified," he said. He said a total of 100 measurable indicators have been identified across nine sectors, which shall give insight of existing status and incremental progress over a period of time.

He said an additional financial assistance of Rs 10 lakh shall be provided to the selected panchayats under the scheme for its further development. Under the Aspirational Towns Development Programme, he said the Urban Reform Incentive Fund (URIF) will incentivise reforms in municipalities. "Jammu and Kashmir Municipal Development Index-2022 is a tool to assess the development of urban local bodies across the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir against the normative development benchmarks. "While J&K MDI will act as a guide to evidence-based policy making, catalyse action to achieve broader developmental outcomes, including sustainable development goals, assess and compare the outcomes achieved by municipal bodies, give citizens an insight into the functioning of local bodies and build a dialogue between the stakeholders, URIF will provide necessary financial incentive to municipalities to undertake reforms in their journey of becoming aspirational towns," he said.

### Defends new land...

"We came out with the new laws based on the Supreme Court ruling". Sinha also said, "Some people are trying to mislead the public (on the issue)." His remark was an apparent reference to the opposition by almost all regional parties -- the National Conference, People's Democratic Party, People's Conference and the Apni Party -- that have termed the new laws an attempt to settle outsiders in Kashmir following the abrogation of Article 370. On Union Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya's letter to Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, requesting him to ensure Covid protocols during his ongoing Bharat Jodo Yatra, Sinha said, "We have no intention of stopping anyone's yatra." The yatra is scheduled to enter Jammu and Kashmir next month. "Many things were stopped during Covid. A decision (to allow or disallow the yatra) will be taken depending on how the situation is next month," Sinha said. The Lieutenant Governor said there was freedom for political and democratic activities in the Union Territory but not anti-nationalism. "If any activity against the country is going to take place, it will be stopped," he said. Asked whether his administration planned to waive Kisan Credit Card loans because of losses suffered by farmers due to the inclement weather, he said the time for waivers had gone. "Farmers' incomes in Jammu and Kashmir over the past two years have increased manifold. Today, our farmers are placed third in the economy chart after Punjab and Haryana.

"Our farmers will have the highest income in the country in the next five years," he said.

added. Another staffer said the modus-operandi adopted by the fraudsters indicates the involvement of insiders, who cannot absolve themselves of the responsibility. The nexus seems deep and widespread as the mystery remained wrapped for months together: Despite the expose, the Bank has not come forward to reassure its clientele about their investments to be safe and action against the gangsters.

STATE TIMES had on December 19 reported an exclusive story 'Over Rs 15 Crores embezzled from J&K Bank; car loans on fictitious salary slips' on the fraud with the fraudsters duping the Bank of crores of rupees by adopting an innovative mechanism. An executive feared that there might be similar other frauds which need to be probed by intensifying internal audit mechanisms and deputation of specially formulated teams to vulnerable branches.

An account in the name of National Horticulture Mission was opened through an e-mail last year in Mendhar Branch of the J&K Bank as a government account, which started operating with deposits of lakhs of rupees purportedly from the government. Consequently around 40 more individual bank accounts of the employees were opened and the salaries from the main account were transferred to the account of each employee. After a few months, the employees, though fictitious, used their salary slips and bank statements, applied for car loans from various J&K Bank branches at Rajouri, Gangyal, Jammu University Campus and Shalamar Road in Jammu. The loans were approved and luxury cars were purchased by the so-called employees. An Audi car purchased on loan from Jammu landed in probe as one of loanees stopped paying installments after two months and subsequently on initial inquiry the loanee's address also turned out to be fictitious. On initial probe, other loanees' addresses too were found to be fake. This raised eyebrows of J&K Bank's management which started an internal probe and found that the main account was also fictitious. There is no such organisation under name and style "National Horticulture Mission," being run by the UT or central government. The Vigilance cell is now making all out efforts to gather all the evidences while the Bank management has not so far decided to handover the case to police for detailed probe and fix the responsibility of bank officers and to book the fraudsters, who used fake documents to embezzle over Rs 15 Crore.

However, the Bank management continues to be tightlipped over this major scandal. According to latest reports, the matter has not been brought to the notice of law enforcing agencies after lodging an FIR.

Both Wani and Musa were killed in separate encounters with security forces. The DGP said the people have to become stakeholders of peace to support the police and civil administration.

work effectively if they are powerless. "Powers have been given to security forces, but some states have said that their powers have been taken away. If we do not give powers to our agencies, how will they be able to work? We must have faith in our security forces, those politicising the issue are supporting drug trafficking," the Home Minister said. Shah said Prime Minister Narendra Modi had spelt out a zero-tolerance policy against the drugs trade and has set a goal of a drugs-free India for the Home Ministry. "We will leave no stone unturned in fulfilling this goal," the minister said. He said the Modi government has a zero-tolerance policy against the narcotics trade and the financing of terrorism from its profits, and every effort was being to eliminate the menace.

"We have mapped the drug network across the states. No matter how big the criminal is, in the next two years there will be a situation where they will be behind bars,"

Shah said.

He said the battle against drugs was delicately poised and urged states to fight the menace together with the central government, keeping aside politics. Shah said the issue of drug menace is a serious one as it destroys lakhs of families. Profits from illegal trade are also used to finance the acts of terror and the presence of dirty money is detrimental to economy.

The minister also said the government will show no mercy towards non-government organisations trying to change the demography of the country and create societal disturbances through foreign funding.

Shah said the government has roped in a number of NGOs to create awareness about drug abuse, but it cannot remain a silent spectator to unmonitored foreign funding of such organisations in the country.

"There are many NGOs that want to disintegrate India's society. There are some NGOs that want to torture India's society. For these NGOs, the Indian government's policy can't be the same.

"Those who don't abide by the FCRA (Foreign Contribution (Regulatory) Act), strong action will be taken against them. There will be no mercy for them," Shah said. On the Opposition's allegations regarding record drug haul in Gujarat, Shah said such instances were a reflection of the state machinery doing its job well.

"If the maximum quantity of drugs is caught in a state, it means that the state has done a good job against drugs. We cannot bury our heads in the sand thinking that the storm will pass us by, the country cannot be saved through an ostrich-like approach," he said.

During the debate, opposition members had targeted the Modi government over the record drug haul in Gujarat and wondered how many consignments of contraband would have gone past the checkpoints.

Shah said any investigation of drugs and seizures should not be seen in isolation. "We have to demolish the drugs network, it is only then that this problem can be solved," he said.

Underlining the challenge posed by the increasing number of COVID-19 cases in some countries across the world such as China, Japan, South Korea, France and the United States, Mandaviya noted the importance of being prepared and remaining alert against new and emerging strains of COVID-19, especially in view of the upcoming festive season. He directed for strengthening of the surveillance system for whole genome sequencing of positive case samples to track the variants through the Indian SARS-CoV-2 Genomics Consortium (INSACOG) network to ensure the timely detection of newer variants, if any, circulating in the country.

This would facilitate the undertaking of appropriate public health measures. States/UTs have been requested to send samples of all COVID-19 positive cases to INSACOG Genome Sequencing Laboratories (IGSLs) on a daily basis, for sequencing, to track new variants, if any, a health ministry statement said.

### Courts Kashmir, Ladakh, in parts of Jammu to observe winter vacation from Jan 2

■ **STATE TIMES NEWS** JAMMU: The High Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh on Wednesday ordered 15-day winter vacation in subordinate courts in Kashmir province and parts of Jammu and Ladakh from January 2, 2023. According to an order, subordinate courts located in Kashmir province, Kishtwar, Doda and some courts in Ramban will observe 15-days of vacation from January 2. "It is notified for the information of all concerned that the Subordinate Courts in Kashmir Province and the Courts located in District Kishtwar; District Doda and Courts located at Batote, Gool, Banihal and Ukhral in District Ramban and Bani in District Kathua as well as all Courts located in the Union Territory of Ladakh shall observe 15 days winter vacations from January 2 to 16, 2023," it reads. The order reads the Principal District and Sessions Judges and Chief Judicial Magistrates of the concerned Districts shall make the suitable arrangements for disposal of urgent criminal business arising during the period of such vacations in the areas within their respective jurisdictions.

■ **STATE TIMES NEWS** SRINAGAR: In a first, Sinthan Pass-- connecting Kashmir to Chenab valley in Jammu region, has been kept open for tourists as well as locals on the first day of Chillai Kalan, which began on Wednesday, officials said.

The road also helps maintain connectivity of Jammu and Kashmir divisions when NH44 is blocked due to adverse weather, they said.

"The move is aimed at promoting winter tourism in Kokernag and providing motorable conditions to the people of far-off areas," Deputy Commissioner Anantnag Basharat Qayoom said.

He said that promotion of winter tourism is a priority area and steps like these are aimed at inviting tourists to explore beautiful destinations at such times in the year when they are usually inaccessible.

Sinthan Top is a mountain pass, a popular tourist destination located between South Kashmir's Breg Valley in Anantnag district and Chatroo in Kishtwar district of Chenab Valley. Qayoom said that winter tourism festivals are also planned in all three important tourist destinations of Pahalgam, Kokernag and Verinag and preparation for these are underway. SDM Kokernag Sarib Sahran said that in Kokernag several such tourist friendly initiatives are being held throughout the year. He said that focus on promoting tourist activities in high altitude areas like Margan and Sinthan top has pushed them to take proactive measures like these.

He said that in collaboration with the Tourism Department steps are underway to create hospitality facilities in both these areas. Historically, the route to Sinthan remains closed for most of winter. However, this year, due to continuous efforts by Revenue authorities and NHIDCL, the road has been kept open in November and December.
