### SIA unearths terror...

six kanals 18 marlas in Pulwama, and non-functional 'Darsgah' (religious school) over four marlas of land at Nowbal Kulgam.

The officials said the SIA's action is part of the seizure of several properties belonging to the JeI. These properties of JeI are the fourth set of properties to be notified in a series of properties belonging to the banned organisation.

The SIA has identified as many as 188 JeI properties across the Union Territory which have either been notified or are under the process of being notified for further legal action, they said.

These are a result of investigation of case FIR number 17 of 2019 U/S 10, 11 and 13 of Police Station Batmaloo being investigated by the agency, they said.

The move is aimed at choking the availability of funds for secessionist activities and to dismantle the ecosystem of anti-national elements and terror networks hostile to India's sovereignty, the officials said.

The action would uproot the menace of terror funding to a great extent in the UT, besides being a stepping stone in ensuring rule of law and a society without fear.

These premises/ structures have been barred and entry and usage has been prohibited reads the notification. Besides "Red entry" to this effect has been made in the relevant revenue records.

During the seizure proceedings, the officials said it was found that about a dozen business establishments in Kulgam including shopping complex at Magam are currently running from these JeI properties on rent basis.

After due diligence, it was decided that these would be allowed to continue so that private persons who may not have any connections with the JeI and are only tenants paying rent to it, are not penalized and their livelihood not impaired.

### Pension applications can...

the Department of Social Welfare had already accorded sanction to the implementation of the Jammu and Kashmir Integrated Social Security Rules 2022 vide order number 156-JK(SWD) dated September 8, 2022 as per which application for grant of pension under the Integrated Social Security Scheme (ISSS) shall be submitted online, an official spokesperson said.

The department said that all the existing and prospective beneficiaries shall upload the necessary documents viz. age certificate, ration card and disability certificate etc. on the online portal (<https://jansugam.jk.gov.in/>) in order to receive financial assistance under the scheme.

Applications and documents shall be submitted through online mode only and the concerned applicants are not required to visit the offices of the Department of Social Welfare for the said purpose, it said.

However, for special assistance in filing online applications and documents, the concerned persons may contact social workers of the department or visit Tehsil Social Welfare Offices/District Social Welfare Offices for the same, the department said.

Sonaullah Bhat, a 62-year-old resident of Malangam in Bandipora district, died at the Tehsil Social Welfare office on December 20 while he was waiting for his turn to submit his documents for verification.

Yasin M Choudhary besides Managing Director JPDCL, Shiv Anant Tayal from J&K UT attended the meeting.

Union Secretary had detailed review and discussion on salient features of RDSS and was apprised of progress on the RDSS scheme implementation by KPDCL. He discussed and took stock of action plan for reduction of AT&C losses to 12-15 per cent by 2024-25 and reduction of ACS-ARR gap to zero by 2024-25.

Union Secretary was informed about the development of smart metering projects and loss reduction schemes viz-a-viz LT AB cabling under RDSS scheme of KPDCL.

He also discussed 13 tender packages under Distribution Infrastructure Works for Loss Reduction and was apprised of its detailed progress.

During the meet, Smart Metering Project was also taken up for discussion and Union Secretary directed the officials of KPDCL to complete the project before the given deadline.

Union Secretary appreciated the groundwork of KPDCL which has resulted in decrease in AT&C loss of the Kashmir Power Distribution Corporation Limited. He directed the officials to speed up appointment of PIAs so that the remaining projects are taken up at an earliest.

The Corporation assured the Union Secretary that they will continue their efforts with same zeal and devotion to further bring down the AT&C losses to around 15% by the end of 2024-2025.

government. Chugh praised Modi government and said that drugs come into India from across the border through drones, smuggling, tunnels, ports and airports. About one lakh more educational institutions and youth have been connected through this through the national online system. Many senior leaders including Dr. Davinder Maniyal and Ashok Kaul attended the meeting.

structure of 5+3+3+4 adopted as per the NEP-2020 guidelines replacing the 10+2 pattern in school education, the new assessment and evaluation scheme takes

effect right from the foundational stage.

The 'Foundational' stage is comprised of the first five years of education, the next three are 'Preparatory' followed by another three years in the 'Middle' stage. The final four years included the grades 9th and 10th in Phase-I and 11th and 12th in Phase-II under the head 'Secondary' stage.

The contents of the evaluation mechanism at every level, including the standard operating procedures, are detailed in a 12-page document signed by Alok Kumar, Principal Secretary Education who also serves as the Director of SCERT.

The foundational stage's evaluation and assessment procedures are to be carried out by the heads of the schools using the models outlined in the school-based assessment (SBA) document by the NCERT/SCERT.

The evaluation and assessment of the Preparatory and Middle stages would also be conducted by the heads of the schools using assessment tools and model question papers prescribed by the SCERT.

The Jammu and Kashmir Board of School Education (JKBOSE) has been given sole responsibility for the Secondary stage, which includes classes 9th through 12th, and will be administered in accordance with NEP-2020 criteria.

For the formative assessment, co-curricular component, and summative assessment, respectively, the weighting of the marks shall be allocated as 30, 20, and 50 with a qualifying percentage of 33% in each. Recitation, art and craft, role playing, painting, group songs, discussion, debates, health and hygiene, environmental awareness, and IT awareness are some of the activities that form the co-curricular component.

Students who have been designated as potential learners will be promoted to the next class on a proviso basis with plans for extra courses for two to three months during the vacation or at the start of the next session, followed by another assessment of grade-appropriate competencies. Only when the student is unable to meet the eligibility requirements in this reassessment tool may they be held back.

The evaluation shall be carried out in the Complex Head under the supervision of the head of the complex and overall supervision of DIET/SCERT.

### Modalities for holding...

He directed the Chief Medical Officers to continue with the contact tracing of positive cases as per the prevailing practice.

He took stock of installation and operationalisation of genome sequencing labs in GMC Srinagar and GMC Jammu and instructed the officers to make these labs operational forthwith.

Director General, Family Welfare, MCH and Immunization, was directed to arrange precautionary dose of COVID vaccination for the vulnerable groups especially healthcare workers and elderly population.

Secretary exhorted upon the officers to motivate and encourage the staff members working in healthcare institutions to follow COVID Appropriate Behaviour while working in the institutions for their personal and safety of the patients as well.

### Resigning from Congress...

reason or justification came as a big surprise to us. Today, we feel that our decision to resign from the Congress in support of Azad was a blunder," Chand, flanked by the leaders and activists, told reporters here.

He said they have a long association with Azad and when he resigned from the Congress, "we felt we should stand with our leader and extend moral support to him".

"The Congress gave me a mandate, made me Congress legislative party leader, speaker and deputy chief minister...We repent our decision today as we feel we betrayed our party, while DAP betrayed us," Chand said.

Asked about their sacking from the DAP, he said "We have not seen such a type of dictatorship in our decades long political careers. Azad rebelled against the Congress leadership, set up a G23 group and even shot letters but he was not sacked by the (Congress) party which believes in internal democracy."

"We opposed the Pradesh Congress Committee (J&K) president at his behest but the party did not serve us any notice. We were working to strengthen the DAP, the party which is yet to get recognition, and we were accused of anti-party activities and sacked without any intimation," he said.

Welcoming Azad's decision, Chand said it had further strengthened them and they are getting support from all across Jammu and Kashmir.

"Many more leaders from Kashmir including former ministers and legislators from DAP and others are joining our group to strengthen the secular vote bank and work for the restoration of the people's rights including the special status under Article 370 of the constitution and statehood.

"Restoration of pre-August 5, 2019 status to Jammu and Kashmir is the popular demand of the people from both the regions of Jammu and Kashmir," he said.

Without naming Azad, he said a "big leader" is saying that it cannot be restored but "we want to tell him that nothing is impossible. It is the popular demand of both the regions and we appeal to the Prime Minister to accept this demand and restore our identity. He is the Prime Minister of the whole country and should hear the voices from J&K."

Chand said he had enjoyed good friendly relations with all parties as he did not consider any party 'untouchable'.

"We are secular and will die as a secular," he said when asked whether he would like to join BJP.

"The leaders inclined towards BJP or Congress or any other party should join any of these parties without hoodwinking the public. We have leaders here who are misleading the public and are dividing the secular votes to benefit one particular party," he said in a veiled attack on the DAP chairman who is being accused by Congress of working at the behest of BJP.

"We will not betray the public and we won't play as an 'A' or 'B' team of any party. We will meet the public and after their consultation, will join a party which is secular and going to form the next government in Jammu and Kashmir," he said.

On Bharat Joda Yatra, he said when National Conference leaders Farooq Abdullah and Omar Abdullah and leaders of other secular parties have expressed their desire to join the yatra which is meant to unite the country, "we do not have any hesitation to be part of it." However, he said nobody from the Congress approached them so far.

### Cong, NC discriminated...

when they allowed reservation for people living along LoC in district Rajouri and Poonch areas from where these two parties got their MLAs elected, some of whom also became Ministers but, denied the same benefit to the people living along IB on Pakistan Border mostly in Kathua and Samba districts because the people here did not vote for these two parties.

He said, this discrepancy was corrected only after the Modi government came to power and the people living near the IB were also given justice by granting 4% reservation on the lines of the people living along LoC.

### Cold conditions intensify...

temperature in Srinagar settled at minus 5.4 degrees Celsius -- down from minus 4.8 degrees Celsius Thursday night, the officials said.

They said Pahalgam, which serves as one of the base camps for the annual Amarnath Yatra, recorded a low of minus 6.4 degrees Celsius.

The famous ski-resort of Gulmarg in north Kashmir's Baramulla district recorded a low of minus 6.4 degrees Celsius -- down from Thursday night's minus 5.5 degrees Celsius.

The minimum temperature in frontier Kupwara district settled at minus 5.2 degrees Celsius, while Qazigund, the gateway town to the valley, recorded a minus of 4.4 degrees Celsius, the officials said.

Kokernag recorded a low of minus 3.9 degrees Celsius.

The MeT Office has forecast mostly dry weather in Jammu and Kashmir till December 26.

Afterwards, the weather is likely to remain generally cloudy between December 26-30 in the UT with a possibility of light to moderate snowfall over the higher reaches, it said.

There would be a slight improvement in the minimum temperature leading to some respite from the cold and dry weather from December 26-31, the MeT office said.

Kashmir is currently under the grip of 'Chilla-i-Kalan' -- the 40-day harshest winter period when a cold wave grips the region and the temperature drops considerably leading to the freezing of water bodies as well as the water supply lines in several parts of the valley. The chances of snowfall are the most frequent and maximum during this period. Most areas, especially in the higher reaches, receive heavy snow-fall.

'Chillai-Kalan' begins on December 21 and ends on January 30. The cold wave continues even after that with a 20-day-long 'Chillai-Khurd' (small cold) and a 10-day-long 'Chillai-Bachha' (baby cold) following it.

## Dr Jitendra to launch revamped probity portal today

NEW DELHI: Union Minister Jitendra Singh will launch a revamped probity portal and e-books on major initiatives and achievements of the Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances & Pensions on Sunday to mark Good Governance Day.

Good Governance Day is celebrated on December 25 to mark the birth anniversary of former prime minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee.

"The new and revamped probity portal and capturing of real-time information using such platform will send a clear signal that 'non-performance' and 'inefficiency' of the government employees will not be tolerated and that the right attitude towards public service with 'integrity' and 'probity' are expected from every government servant," an official statement issued on Saturday said.

In 2017, a dedicated online portal (<https://probity-dopt.nic.in>) was made functional for obtaining the data from all the ministries/departments/autonomous organisations/public sector banks in respect of number of cases pending for sanction for prosecution, number of major and minor penalty disciplinary proceedings and review of non-performing government employees among others.

The Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT) has now completely revamped the existing probity portal in order to add more functionalities to improve the user experience and optimising the website to collect the data on new data points/parameters, which will help in generating comprehensive reports on various modules, said the statement issued by the Personnel Ministry.

All the user departments will undertake to submit updated data on a monthly basis, which would be made available on probity portal, it added.

The release of website is part of the Good Governance Week celebrations (from 19th to 25th December).

Singh, the Minister of State for Personnel, will also launch revamped e-HRMS 2.0 portal as the earlier iteration was limited in scope, where employees could avail limited services and it was not connected with other human resources applications.

As a result, the employees were unable to get full benefits of digital service deliveries and seamless connection with IHR applications and initiatives of the government.

The revamped e-HRMS 2.0 portal will provide services like transfers (rotation/mutual), deputation, Annual Performance Appraisal Report (APAR), Immovable Property Returns (IPR), iGOT (integrated government online) training, vigilance status, deputation opportunities, service book and other basic HR services like leave, tour, reimbursements etc. in a digital mode to the employees, the statement said.

The revamped e-HRMS 2.0 is the first digital system in the government of India to provide end-to-end HR services, it said, adding that presently, no other government service cadre system in India is as advanced in its reach and applications, as the revamped e-HRMS 2.0.

"This will also go a long way in improving employee satisfaction, promoting ease of doing/processing HR work and enhancing productivity and transparency in administrative functioning," the ministry said.

The minister will also launch mobile application of iGoT Karmayogi portal with an aim to create professional, well trained and future ready civil service for India.

The iGOT Karmayogi platform is envisaged as a democratised, competency driven solution space that all of the government can access to enhance their execution capabilities. Singh will also launch e-books on consolidation of government instructions and on major reforms and achievements of DoPT since 2014, among others.
