JAMMU: After giving heavy thrashing to Arunachal Pradesh and Nagaland in their first two outings of the tournament, despite suffering from an 8-wicket defeat against strong Karnataka on Friday in the Women's U-15 One Day Tournament at Saurashtra Cricket Association Stadium-B Rajkot, the Jammu and Kashmir eves saw a lot of positives from this loss.

Lakshmi was dismissed on her individual score of 21 runs off 42 balls, studded with 3 boundaries. Finally, J&K scored 87/9 in the stipulated 35 overs. Sania Slathia scored 22 runs off 44 balls with 2 fours.
For Karnataka, Vandita K Rao was the wrecker-in-chief who took 5 wickets by conceding 16 runs in her 7 overs, while Veda Varshini and Inchara CU claimed one wicket each.

In reply, Karnataka chased the target easily in 17.5 overs by losing 2 wickets, thus won the match by 8 wickets. Inchara CU was the top scorer with 34 runs off 45 balls, studded with 6 boundaries, while H Bhavika Reddy and Sherya S Chavan contributed 20 and 19 runs to the total respectively.
For J&K, left-arm seam bowler, Sheetal Devi and Manya Banotra claimed one

wicket each.
It is pertinent to mention here that recovering from 9/4 to make it 87/9 in 35 overs against a strong side is unquestionably a new thing in J&K women cricket, which brings positivity in all of us, because as per the precedence, in such situations (9/4), J&K earlier would have managed to score just 25-30 runs in their innings. Dairy Farms and Gaushalas Operators

Environmental Management of Dairy waste as per directions issued by Hon'ble NGT in O.A No. 46/2018 for Dairy Farms / Gaushalas

It is hereby notified for all the operators / owners of dairy farms / gaushalas of J&K that as per Hon'ble NGT directions and subsequently issued revised Guidelines of July, 2021, by CPCB, regarding waste management in dairy farms & gaushalas, the following mandatory compliance shall be made by each concerned:

- All operators and owners of Dairy farms and Gaushalas shall follow the "Guidelines for Environmental Management of Dairy Farms and Gaushalas" issued by CPCB (revised), uploaded on JK PCC website at www.jkpcb.nic.in.
- All operators and owners of Dairy Farms and Gaushalas shall ensure that dung generated within the premises is preferably treated by the owner adopting any of the available feasible technologies, viz., composting / vermin-composting, bio-methanation or cattle dung log making or handed over to concerned local body.
- All operators and owners of Dairy Farms and Gaushalas shall ensure that waste water generated from the dairy farms and Gaushalas is adequately treated before being discharged and it must not percolate and pollute groundwater.
- Dairy Farms and Gaushalas should be adequately ventilated with sufficient space for each animal for standing, resting, loafing, movement and feeding.
- All registered operators and owners of Dairy Farms with 15 animals and above have to obtain Consent to Establish (CTE) / Consent to Operate (CTO) under Water Act, 1974 and Air Act, 1981 under 'Orange' category..
- All registered operators and owners of Gaushalas with 15 animals and above have to obtain Consent to Establish (CTE) / Consent to Operate (CTO) under Water Act, 1974 and Air Act, 1981 under 'Green' category, while Gaushalas with waste water generation more than 100 KLD shall fall under Orange category.
- Siting criteria shall be applicable to all new establishments only.

In the light of above, all operators and owners of Dairy Farms & Gaushalas are again advised to ensure the implementation of directions stated above and obtain consent of JK PCC through the online portal (jkocms.nic.in) with prior registration (Provisional) from Urban Local Bodies / Department of Rural Sanitation.

"Environmental Compensation" shall be imposed in case of any violation of Environmental norms on Polluter Pays Principle under the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 and Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981 and Environmental (Protection) Act, 1986 after 31-01-2023.
