KUPWARA: The Deputy Commissioner (DC) Kupwara, Doifode Sagar Dattatray, who is also District Panchayat Election Officer, Kupwara on Sunday convened a meeting of concerned officers to finalize the preparation for re-poll of DDC constituency Drugmulla, scheduled on 5th of this month.

SSP Kupwara, Yougal Manhas and Dy. DEO Kupwara, Mehraj-u-din was present in the meeting. The DC took stock of preparedness, by deliberating on actions & plans of concerned departments in respect of deployment of Zonal, Sectoral Magistrates/Officers, deployment and randomization of polling staff, training of staff, distribution of election material, Control Room for grievance redressal, transport and security arrangements. The DC gave directions to all concerned to put up their best efforts for smooth conduct of the election and asked Nodal Officer to enforce the Model Code of Conduct strictly. While reviewing the detailed arrangements of transport,

security and material management, he instructed that fool-proof arrangements be kept in place for ensuring hassle free movement of men and material. Emphasizing on efficient tackling of poll related grievances, he said that control Room will function round the clock for grievance redressal. The DC was apprised by concerned Nodal Officers about the finalization of proper and adequate arrangements especially on allotment of polling staff and their training, installation and provision of Assured Minimum Facilities (AMF).

The meeting was attended by Nodal Officers, Sectoral and Zonal Magistrates/Officers. Later, the Deputy Commissioner along with SSP Kupwara inspected the deployment of polling staff and material at ACD Office Kupwara. The Deputy Commissioner was informed that the polling staff and polling material has been dispatched for all 42 polling stations.

Dy. DEO, Returning Officer, ARO, Nodal Officers and election staff were present at the occasion.

Plug routes of smuggling, save youth from drug abuse: Kesri

ARNIA: Under the chairmanship of Shiv Sena Hindustan J&K President Pandit Rajesh Kesri, a unit of Shiv Sena Hindustan was formed at village Chak Murar of Block Bishnah, in which Ajay Kumar made President, Jagdish Kumar Vice-President, Rohit Kumar Chairman, Sham Lal Secretary and Manjot Kumar appointed treasurer.

Addressing the media persons, Kesri said that today the unit of Shiv Sena Hindustan was formed in this village because of rise in bovine smuggling here, we give the status of our mother to the mother cow, the Hindus give milk to the child of mother cow after their mother and that is why she has been given the status of mother in Hinduism, but some mischievous people who belong to other communities involved in bovine smuggling which is strictly prohibited.

Kesri alleged that they steal the cows from the village here, load them in trucks and sale them in Srinagar

Muslim areas, where the mother cow is killed.

To stop this and also to address drugs menace in the village spoiling younger generation by making them drugs addicted, Shiv Sena Hindustan has framed a unit here to keep an eagle eye on those who are spreading drugs among youth in the area. He said Shiv Sena Hindustan is committed to save younger generation from drugs and in this regard will organize awareness and counseling sessions with addicted youth and their parents. Expressing serious concern over the reports of drug cartels active in different parts of State especially in Jammu region and supplying drugs among youth thereby ruining their lives, Kesri strongly demanded plugging of all routes of smuggling from across the border, to save younger generation from epidemic of drug abuse. We appreciate the record number of FIRs and seizures of drugs

worth millions from different parts of J&K but a million dollar question still remains unanswered that why all channels through which large contraband of drugs are pouring in from the neighbouring Pakistan have not been properly plugged, despite all intelligence inputs," highlighted Kesri. He further questioned the Government that what concrete steps have been taken so far to put a proper check in several parts of South Kashmir, where narcotics are being cultivated regularly. How many FIRs have been registered so far against all those persons who are cultivating drug crops? He however appreciated SHO Bishnah Vikram Sharma for playing an active role in curbing menace of drugs in the area. We want the Police to do more so that the enemies of the erstwhile Princely State of Jammu and Kashmir who are doing sin of destroying younger generation should be given exemplary punishment.

The month long campaign has been divided into different activity based schedules which will be carried at Village Level Organizations, Cluster Level federations, Block Mission Management Units and then at District Mission Management Unit of National Rural Livelihoods Mission Shopian. Among others, the function was attended by staff of District Legal Services Authority (DLSA) Shopian, Integrated Child Protection Scheme (ICPS) Shopian, Mahila Shakti Kendra (MSK) Shopian, One Stop Center (OSC) and NRLM (UMEED). Resource persons of collaborating departments provided their information to SHG members and shared their supporting structure by which any type of women violence which gets identified, will be dealt in a well-structured manner.
