The last session was marred by regular disruptions in Parliament.

Noting that he had congenial discussion with various leaders during a recent allparty meet on India's presidency of G20, he expressed hope that its reflection will definitely be seen in Parliament too.



Mask-men rob businessman's family on gunpoint; made hostage for over five hours

JAMMU: A major dacoity has taken place in Gandhi Nagar locality of Jammu wherein, according to complainant family, about a dozen masked gunmen barged into their house in Gandhi Nagar and made them hostage for about five hours, before decamping with lakhs of rupees.

Initially, crores of rupees were demanded from them but later they fled away with Rs 7 lakh from the house, the complainant family informed the police.

The incident panicked the city as the incident took place in the posh area of the

city and was reported on social media. Apart from this, there is J&K Police Lines nearby, but in spite of all this, such a big robbery has taken place showing a major security lapse.

CCTVs are being scanned after this incident. All efforts are being made by the police to find out any clue.

According to the complaint, Rakesh Aggarwal, a businessman, where he was taking a walk inside his house at around 7:00AM, about a dozen gunmen entered into his house and took him inside the house at gun point. At that time Rakesh

3 KPs among 14 minority members killed in J&K so far in 2022: Govt

NEW DELHI: As many as 14 people belonging to minority communities. including three Kashmiri Pandits, have been killed in Jammu and Kashmir this year so far, the Rajya Sabha was informed on

Wednesday. Union Minister of State for Home Nityanand Rai said 180 terrorists, 31 security personnel and 31 civilians were also killed in J-K in 123 terrorist incidents this year so far.

"14 persons belonging to minorities including three Kashmiri Pandits have been killed in Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir since January, 2022 till November 30, 2022," he said replying to

a written question Rai said there were certain media reports of Kashmiri Sangharsh Samiti highlighting their security concerns and various measures have been taken by the government to protect the lives of minorities which include group security in the form of static guards, day and night area domination, round the clock 'nakas' at strategic points among others.

Under Prime Minister's Development Package, 2015, 3,000 government for Kashmiri jobs migrants have been created of which, 2,639 have been appointed in the last five years, he said.
