

The three-week dry spell in Kashmir ended with snowfall in the higher reaches of the Valley and rains in the plains. Most of the hills in various districts in the Jammu region also received fresh snowfall while the rains lashed Jammu city.

The Mughal road has been blocked due to heavy snowfall high-altitude areas between Poshana and Pir ki Gali area, officials said, adding no vehicle will be allowed to move towards the
