The loan amount was disbursed into the accounts of the land owners but the land has not been mortgaged to the bank.

in rivers and therefore, around 85% of power supply during winters is sourced from thermal plants to compensate for the deficit during winters.

The spokesman reiterated that the UT is making every effort to ensure sustain able and firm power availability throughout the year. In this direction, during the current financial year, the UT has entered into historic Power Purchase Agreement (PPAs) for 1600 MW of Solar power, 900 MW from Hydro, and an additional 500 MW from thermal plants, currently in progress following the decision of the UT Administrative Council under the Shakti policy. This will not only lead towards resource adequacy for the region, but will also provide an optimal mix of Hydro Thermal, Solar generation, while the efforts are underway to harness wind power as well so that the strength behind renewable energy is utilized to the maximum.

Addressing concerns raised in a recent news item published in one of the local new dailies on November 30, 2023, highlighting a surge in interruptions in J&K, the spokesperson reiterated that a persistent issue contributing to these interruptions is the non-disclosure of actual electric load by consumers.

Regarding the hours of power supply to consumers, the spokesperson conveyed that smart metering is under implementation in mission mode and focus is on ensur ing uninterrupted and regular power supply in areas saturated with smart meters while also curbing losses.

In areas without smart metering, the department is sustaining the same number of power supply hours as maintained during the previous year. Moreover, there is curtailment schedule in effect which is diligently being published to prevent any inconvenience to the public. The spokesman further emphasized that contrary to the mention of Hammams in the news item, electricity remains the primary and pre ferred source for heating, with people using crude nichrome wires or non-thermosta fitted heaters which remain operational throughout the day.

Recognizing the urgency, the spokesman emphasized on discontinuing the use of obsolete and environmentally unfriendly electric heating systems. The spokesman also mentioned that numerous crude heaters which have been banned by the depart ment were recovered by the enforcement squads of KPDCL in the recently conduct

Court acquits 9 accused in alleged anti-Indian activities

JAMMU: Ist Additional Sessions Judge Srinagar Khursheed-Ul-Islam acquitted nine accused who were allegedly involved in anti-Indian activities, as prosecution miserably failed.

According to prosecution on 28th June, 2010, Police Station Sadder, Srinagar received a written docket Firdous Ahmad/PW-1, wherein it has been stated that he along with the personnel of 29th Bn. Of CRPF were conducting the routine patrolling and during their patrolling duty a crowd of people comprised around 300 people which was headed by Firdous Ahmad Ganie and ors appeared on the road with lathies and stones and attacked the police party and security forces and also damaged the government property. The crowd was raising the anti-Indian slogans and was

spreading hatred against India. On receipt of the docket FIR No. 129/2010 was registered.

Court after hearing both the sides observed that charges against the accused came to be framed for the commission of offences 11/8 147, 148, 149, 336, 332, 341, 323, 427, 121-A, 307 RPC the contents of the charge have been read over and explained to the accused, who pleaded not guilty to the charges leveled against them, which led to the direction upon the prosecution to produce the witnesses. The prosecution has not produced any witness in the case despite repeated number of opportunities. Many a times last and final opportunity was given to the prosecution to produce the evidence but the prosecution has not been in a position to get examined any witness enlisted in the Challan, On 29th August, 2023 once again last and final opportunity was granted to the prosecution for production of the evidence and it was impressed upon the prosecution that in case they fail to produce any witness on the next date, the prosecution evidence will be deemed to have been closed. When despite clear and unambiguous directions the prosecution could not produce any witness, the prosecution evidence was closed and the case was listed for the argu-

Court further observed that from the perusal of the file it is clear that the prosecution has not been in a position to examine even a single witness in the case. The prosecution has miserably failed to prove their case, therefore the case of the prosecution is dismissed for want of evidence. The accused are acquitted from the charges leveled against them.

HC directs J&K Govt not to issue Reserved Category Certificate to
