MESSAGE

While great strides have been made over the four decades since the first known reported case of AIDS - this disease still remains a public health challenge. Today around 86 percent people living with HIV know their status but we still have a long way to go especially reaching out to people living with HIV who do not know their status and ensuring that they are linked to quality care, support and prevention services.

Jammu & Kashmir AIDS Control Society (JKACS) is the agency which is implementing the National AIDS Control Programme of MOH&FW, Government of India in the UT of J&K. It is providing free and confidential testing and counseling services at ICTCs and FICTCs established at Government Hospitals across J&K. Unfortunately, many barriers in availing HIV services remain prevalent in our societies. Stigma and discrimination still deters people from coming forward openly for HIV testing. Access to confidential HIV testing is still an issue of concern in many communities. Even today many people still get tested after becoming ill and symptomatic which need to be changed.

The focus of this year's World AIDS Day is on the leadership role of communities and the differences they create in the lives of people. This day provides us with an important opportunity to recognize the essential role communities have played and continue to play in the AIDS response at the international, national and local levels. We need to adopt proven practical solutions which are required to address inequalities and which will further help us in ending AIDS by 2030.

On this World AIDS Day let us reaffirm our own commitment to confront and defeat HIV/AIDS.
