Entities securing 100-130 marks are certified as having '1-Leaf Status', 130-180 marks as 3-Leaf Status and those scoring between 180-200 as the best with '5-Leaf Status', as was informed during this launch ceremony. Later on the Chief Secretary with other participants including Secretary, Tourism (GoI); Director, DDWS, GoI;Chairperson, Anantnag; Commissioner Secretary, RDD; Secretary, Tourism; and District Development Commissioner released a document explaining the procedure and importance of this rating system and benefits for the sector adopting it for their
