Time Use Survey (TUS) provides a framework for measuring time dispositions by the population on different activities. Time Use Survey can capture time disposition

on different aspects of human activities, be it paid, unpaid or other activities with such details which is otherwise not possible in other surveys.

Time Use Survey (TUS) will be an important source of information on the time spent in unpaid care giving activities. unpaid volunteer work, unpaid domestic service producing activities of the household members. This will also provide information on time spent on learning, socializing, leisure activities, self-care activities, etc. by the household members. The ITP was inaugurated by Kishore Deputy Director Kumar General National Sample Office, (Field Survey Operations Division) under Ministry of Statistics &Programme implementation (MoSPI), Government of India. In his inaugural address he highlighted the role of National Sample Survey Office in developing a sound

Statistical Database for the use by planners and policy makers, researchers and various other agencies at the National and International level and outlined in detail the significance of present Survey. Kumar requested the people of the State to give full cooperation to the field Officers/ Officials of the NSSO, (FOD), Government of India and provide correct & reliable information.
