JAMMU: Samagra Shiksha under the aegis of School Education Department (SED) on Sunday organized an impressive function on the eve of International Day of Persons with Disabilities (IDPD) at Teacher's Bhawan here. Principal Secretary, Education, Alok Kumar was the Chief Guest on the occasion.

Commissioner Secretary, Social Welfare, Sheetal Nanda; Project Director Samagra Shiksha, Director School Education Jammu and other senior officers of the SED were present on the occasion.

The event witnessed extraordinary cultural events showcasing the unique talent of Specially abled children drawn from schools of across the UT.

Addressing the gathering, the Principal Secretary lauded the spe-

cially abled students for performing with their best talent on the stage like folk dances, folk music, contemporary dance, singing and mimes.

He also reiterated that the aim of IDPD is to encourage the specially abled students, adding that specially abled students must be renamed as specially talented students as they performed at par with professional people.

Alok Kumar maintained that all the facilities need to provided under Inclusive Education so that the students may excel in their life and may fight with the challenges they face. He remarked that awareness needs to be imparted to general public, about the rights, security and development of Children with Special Needs.

While mentioning the role of SED, Principal Secretary said that under Samagra Shiksha 64 fully

equipped resource rooms have been constructed wherein 83 special educators/resource persons are working for providing educational as well as therapeutic support to Children with Special needs (CWSN).

He also added that Assessments Camps are being organized in all 188 Zones and free aids and appliances are being distributed among the CWSN. He highlighted that as a remarkable achievement, 4990 children have been provided assistive devices under Samagra Shiksha in the current year in collaboration with ALIMCO.

The Principal Secretary further said that more than Rs. 2.35 Crores have been disbursed to CWSN on account of allowances during current year through DBT Mode. He also highlighted that 550 CWSN friendly toilets have also been constructed in

the Government Schools.

Speaking on the occasion, Commissioner Secretary, SWD, said that specially abled children are having lot of potential which depicted from their performances in the cultural event. She remarked that school education and social welfare departments are jointly taking several initiatives for upliftment of Specially Abled Children who are enrolled in Government Schools.

The Commissioner Secretary also underlined several welfare schemes being implemented by the Social Welfare department for welfare of CWSN and urged the stakeholders to avail their due benefits.

She added that parents and students should show courage and come forward for the education in Schools under Inclusive education. "Teachers as mentors who can do miracles in the life of children with special

needs by supporting them and they are doing at their best", she maintained.

Earlier, Project Director, Samagra Shiksha in his welcome address briefed about the different initiatives taken for welfare of Children with Special Needs under Inclusive Education scheme of Samagra Shiksha. He highlighted that efforts are being made to encourage students to attend the school and special educators/resource teachers are working tirelessly for imparting Education to these children.

He informed the gathering that presently 21000 Children with Special needs are enrolled in various schools across the UT and getting benefits under inclusive education. He also intimated that special exposure tours and sports activities have been organised for the CWSN in the current year across the UT and reiterated that department encourages the NGOs genuinely working for specially abled children. During the programme a Specially abled children in sign language presented National Anthem which mesmerized the audience with patriotic emotion.

The children were also felicitated on the occasion in different fields like academics, fine arts, Sports or other fields.

It's mandate for 'Modi Guarantee', 'Double Engine': Dr Jitendra

NEW DELHI: It's a mandate for "Modi Guarantee" and "Double Engine", said Union Minister Dr Jitendra Singh while summing up his response to election results of four States in a series of media interviews to different news channels at the BJP National Headquarters at Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Marg, here on Sunday.

Dr. Jitendra said, people have authenticated their trust in what Modi says because it has been proven time and again with evidence that Modi has the capacity to "walk the talk".

As for the "Double Engine Sarkar" is concerned, Dr. Jitendra recalled that during the election campaign, many critics took this

impression with a pinch of salt but he had repeatedly reiterated even at that time that the common man understands the essence of this impression.

He said, for example, in Rajasthan, the common man did not say this in mincing words but in heart of hearts he could sense that he was not getting the benefits of Modi's welfare schemes to the same extent as was being received by the people in the neighbouring States like Gujarat and Uttar Pradesh.

Misuse of funds and lack of accountability to the Centre has taken their toll in both Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh and particularly the young voters could realise this, he added.

About Telangana, Dr. Jitendra

Singh said, Congress victory is by default because it has benefited by the negative vote against BRS.

However, for BJP, he said, it is a qualitative vote because BJP has succeeded in enlarging its ideological base in spite of all the contradictions.

Another important factor emerging from the election results one after the other, said Dr. Jitendra, is that Modi has sought to introduce a new political culture in this country which, unlike in the past, is above caste, creed and vote bank consideration.

For example, the benefits of welfare schemes like Ujjawala and PM Awas Yozna went to those who needed them regardless of their political and religious kneeling.

In addition, Modi has sought to

address those sections of society which were hitherto neglected by the earlier governments.

The example of which is PM Swanidhi Yojna for street vendors and Vishwakarma Yojna for traditional Artisans, he said.

About who would be the chief minister in the three States won by BJP, Dr Jitendra said, this question is asked because the mind-set is conditioned by half a century of Congress rule where the preferences are dynasty driven and decisions are taken on the dining table.

In BJP, on the other hand, he said, there is a convention and a system in place where decisions are taken with the consensus of all and then unanimously accepted by all, he said.

Whereas, the initiating official entrusted with scrutiny & processing of applications uploaded through online portal found that there is an element of suspicion about the credentials of applicant's eligibility;

Whereas, the above inputs were taken on record & as an abundant precaution, a confidential exercise was initiated with the competent authority of Manav Bharti University, Solan, H.P who responded vide their communication with below text:

"This is with reference to your letter no. JKPC-Estt/2574-76 dated 05 Jan, 2023. In this regards it is submitted that communication no: MBU/Ref./2022/4836, Dated: 17.11.2022 is not issued by Manav Bharti University."

Whereas, the response highlighted herein above clearly indicates that the claims of eligibility by the applicant are not bonafide & further the said person has indulged in unfair means;

Whereas, at the time of filing the application through online portal, the applicant has also submitted an affidavit duly sworn before 1st Class Judicial Magistrate, Panthachowk, Srinagar with one of the below averments:

"That in the event, my eligibility for registration as Pharmacist is found to have been acquired through misrepresentation, impersonation or concealment of material facts and found false, the Pharmacy Council shall have a right to strike off my registration as Pharmacist ab-initio without providing me any opportunity for being heard."

Whereas, the above person was offered an opportunity to provide his response in the matter through show cause notice vide this office letter bearing no: JKPC/SCN/2023/PHAR/729-741, Dated: 14.08.2023:

Whereas, no reply was received from the applicants end;

Whereas, the applicant has failed to respond to the communications reflected in para supras and therefore the applicant has not availed of his right to be heard before a decision in the matter is taken.

Now, therefore the undersigned in exercise of powers vested under Section (36) of the Pharmacy Act, 1948 rejects the application of the applicant for registration as Pharmacist in terms of Section 32 of the Pharmacy Act, 1948 and the name of the applicant is hereby removed from the register maintained by the J&K Pharmacy Council with immediate effect.
