

Ritika mocks opposition for blaming EVMs for defeat in Assembly polls

JAMMU: Chief Spokesperson BJP Mahila Morcha JKUT Ritika Trehan on Tuesday asserted that the BJP has emerged as the first choice of the people of country and the fall of opposition is a certainty in the coming general election. In a handout issued here, Ritika mocked some opposition leaders raising questions on EVMs as BJP emerged victorious in three Hindi heartland states- Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh in the recent round of Assembly polls, saying they are looking for excuses to hide their own shortcomings. Ritika slammed the opposition and said they blame EVMs whenever they fail to win elections. "There is nothing new. The opposition, whoever it may



be, when they win, they are fine with the EVMs, but when they lose, they blame it on the EVMs," she said. She said with these EVMs, the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) won elections in Delhi thrice and in Punjab once, the Samajwadi Party (SP) got an absolute majority (in Uttar Pradesh) in 2012, the Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) got an absolute majority (in Uttar Pradesh) in 2007 and the

Congress won Telangana. Ritika said, "EVMs have been there for the last 18-19 years. They (opposition) do not raise these questions when they win elections. Do they not trust people? I think after repeated defeats, it is ridiculous that the opposition still raises this." She said, "It was known that they would blame the EVMs. Their brains have stopped working. Their corruption and appeasement have been rejected by people, so they are saying such immature things." "The country has rejected the opposition. In the future, the BJP will win every election," she asserted. She said, "The opposition will keep crying over EVMs and Prime Minister Narendra Modi will come back with 400 (Lok Sabha) seats next year."

DB directives in PIL regarding preservation of Sonamarg

JAMMU: In a public interest litigation regarding PIL regarding preservation of Sonamarg, a Division Bench of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court comprising Chief Justice N Kotishwar Singh and Justice MA Chowdhary issued various directions. When the PIL came-up for hearing, Division Bench observed that Ilias Laway, GA has brought to the notice of this Court on the basis of response filed by the Chief Executive Officer Sonmarg Development Authority that as regards accommodation of two categories i.e., (I) Hotels and (II) Huts and integrated tourist resorts in the chart so provided, it appears that as regards Hotels, the proposed area as per Master Plan in hectares is 8.87 and the proposed plinth area would be 5.26 hectares and out of which already 3.25 hectares of plinth

area has been consumed, thus leaving the plinth area of 1.98 hectares for category-I i.e., Hotels. As regards to II-category i.e., Huts and Integrated tourist resorts, it appears that the proposed area as per the Master Plan for accommodation is 26.20 hectares. As regards to the said category of accommodation nothing has been indicated as to the proposed plinth area available or the consumed plinth area for Huts and Integrated tourist resorts. DB observed that be that as it may, from the above figures, it appears that certain areas are available for construction of Hotels/ Huts and Integrated tourist resorts. The said chart, however, is conditional by the statement of the Chief Executive Officer Sonamarg Development Authority to the effect that the comprehensive report for the various other facilities as per the Master Plan

vis-a-vis factual report on ground and proposed land used would be completed once the proper satellite imagery is provided by National Remote Sensing Center (NRSC). Thus, it appears that the aforesaid figures are tentative in nature which would be finalized only after obtaining proper satellite imagery, DB said. Under the circumstances, Division Bench is of the view that it may not be appropriate for us to pass any definitive order allowing or not allowing the various applications filed for repairing/construction of Hotels/Huts and Integrated tourist resorts, which can be done only after obtaining the final and comprehensive report from the Sonamarg Development Authority. DB further said that in the meantime, the Building Operations Control Authority (BOCA) Sonamarg, may proceed with the various applications pending before it and consider the same strictly in accordance with the Master Plan and the available area as reflected in the records. However, any permission, if granted by the BOCA, will be implemented only after being permitted by this Court after hearing all the concerned parties and considering the various aspects involved in the matter. DB further directed the respondents to file the response as regards the serious threat to environment and unregulated traffic management because of large number of local Taxis (commercial) operating in the Sonamarg area. Govt Advocate Ilias Laway, while appearing for the respondents submitted that Assistant Regional Transport Officer (ARTO) Ganderbal may be directed to file response as he will be in a better position to regulate the traffic in the area, DB Ordered accordingly.

"Captain Geetika Koul from the Snow Leopard Brigade becomes the first woman medical officer of the Indian Army to be deployed at the world's highest battlefield, Siachen after successfully completing the induction training at Siachen Battle School," Fire and Fury Corps said in a post on X.

Siachen, located in the northern Himalayas, poses challenges due to its strategic importance, harsh climate, and demanding terrain.

Cold condition intensifies in Kashmir

SRINAGAR: Cold conditions in Kashmir intensified as the mercury settled below freezing point at most places in the Valley, officials said on Tuesday. Pahalgam in south Kashmir's Anantnag district, which serves as one of the base camps for the annual Amarnath yatra, saw the mercury settling at minus 4.3 degrees Celsius, they said. It was the coldest area in

the Valley on Monday night. Gulmarg in Baramulla district recorded a low of minus 2.3 degrees Celsius while the minimum temperature in Srinagar fell below the freezing point for the first time in five days, settling at minus 1.4 degrees Celsius, the officials said. Qazigund recorded a low of minus 1.6 degrees Celsius, down from minus 0.4 degrees Celsius the

previous night, they said. Kokernag town in south Kashmir was the only station in the valley which registered a minimum temperature above the freezing point at 0.2 degrees Celsius, while Kupwara recorded a low of minus 1.7 degrees Celsius. The meteorological office said the weather would remain partly to generally cloudy, but mainly dry till December 10. PTI MIJ
