KISHTWAR: Development Department (PDD) Division Kishtwar conducted a rigorous inspection drive in the town area to curb the unabated use of banned nichrome-based heaters and boilers, as well as to seize unauthorised

The operation led by Executive Assistant Engineer Er. Showkat Khan of the Electric Sub-Division Kishtwar, along with a dedicated team of engineers and field staff, aimed to prevent overloading of feeders and safeguard expensive power infrastructure and cables from frequent damage.

During the drive, approximately 140 banned and unauthorised heaters, boilers and other gadgets were confiscated and destroyed by the team. This proactive measure resulted in a significant reduction of nearly half a megawatt (MW) of load, bringing much-needed relief to the strained power distribution system.
