LS passes Railways...

Minister Ashiwni Vaishnaw targeted the opposition, saying their "fake narrative" regarding railways will fall flat just like the one about the Constitution

"A few members have said the Bill will lead to privatisation of railways, an attempt has been made to set a fake narrative. I want to appeal to them with all sincerity not to do this, their one fake narrative about the Constitution has already failed," Vaishnaw said.

The Railways (Amendment) Bill 2024 which seeks to enhance the functionng and independence of the Railway Board was introduced in the Lok Sabha during the previous Parliament session.

With the inclusion of the Railway Board under the 1989 Railway Act, the ppointment, qualifications, tenure and criteria for the Chairman and mem bers of the Board will be the responsibility of the central government.

As part of the plan to improve railway operations, the Bill also includes provisions to appoint an independent regulator that will oversee matters like fare determination and ensure the competitiveness of the Railways. Earlier, during the debate, opposition members alleged that the Bill would

lead to the privatisation of railways and demanded that it be referred to a joint parliamentary committee for further scrutiny.

They also requested the restoration of concessions for senior citizens. Vaishnaw stressed the need to significantly enhance the capacity of the coun-

"Ours is a country of 1.40 crore people which is a rapidly growing economy. There is a need to significantly enhance railway's capacity. There has been a lack of investment in railways for over 50-60 years.

"When PM Modi took over in 2014, the railways budget which used to be around Rs 25,000-30,000 crore, was increased to Rs 2.52 lakh crore.

"Railway tracks up to 31,000 km have been added since then, including 5300 km within the last year which is more than Switzerland's entire railway coverage," he said.

Jammu equally important...

Chief Minister said while holding an extensive interaction with members of Jammu's civil society at his official residence.

This marks his first meeting with Jammu's civil society since assuming office as Chief Minister of Jammu and Kashmir. A similar interaction was held on 30th October this year with civil society representatives in Kashmir.

Reiterating that his government represents all citizens of Jammu and Kashmir, regardless of their political affiliations, he said Jammu is equally important as Kashmir from governance perspective.

Omar Abdullah highlighted his deliberate decision to appoint a Deputy Chief Minister from Jammu, not out of compulsion but to underscore that Jammu s as integral to this government as Kashmir. Addressing the concerns about the Darbar Move, the Chief Minister reaf-

firmed his government's commitment restore this biannual administrative tra-

"Some things cannot be weighed merely in financial terms. The Darbar Move symbolizes the unity and inclusivity of Jammu and Kashmir. It is a tradition that ensures governance remains accessible to both regions.

He dismissed financial arguments against this 150 year old practice which has now been stopped, stating, "The role of the government is not to focus solely on profit. Our responsibility is to serve and ensure balanced development across regions. Ending the Darbar Move would only alienate the people of the two regions from one another and harm the collective unity we strive to pre-

The event brought together a diverse group of stakeholders, including representatives of women's organizations, non-governmental organizations, ex-servicemen, Kashmiri Pandits, traders, hoteliers, tourism players, transport associations, religious leaders, pensioners, senior folk singers, Sikh representatives, RTI activists, and leaders from various political parties.

The Chief Minister expressed concern over Jammu's limited share of the burgeoning tourism industry and laid out plans to diversify the region's economy. "Over one crore pilgrims visit Mata Vaishno Devi annually, but we have yet

to tap into even 15 percent of this potential to promote tourism in Jammu. If

we can redirect a fraction of these pilgrims, Jammu's economy can transform,

He announced plans to establish a craft & culture fair modeled on the Surajkund Mela, to showcase the region's rich heritage and boost tourism. The initiative will involve collaboration between industries, farmers, cultural representatives, and tourism stakeholders, he stated.

Chief Minister Omar Abdullah highlighted several key issues raised during the interaction and outlined his government's commitment to addressing

He said that Smart City projects are nearing completion and there is no scope for this government to do any course correction but we shall take new initiatives for Jammu and Srinagar, which aim to modernize the city's infrastructure and enhance its liveability.

The government, he said, will resolve the shortage of Punjabi teachers in schools catering to Sikh children and address some of their genuine concerns Acknowledging the challenges faced by the Kashmiri Pandit community, the Chief Minister stated, "While their return depends on restoring a sense of security among the community, we are committed to improving their living conditions and addressing their grievances."

The Chief Minister emphasized the need for regular dialogue with civil soci ety to maintain a pulse on ground realities. Unlike in the past, when such meetings were convened only during crises, he committed to holding biannual interactions-twice each in both the regions of Jammu and Kashmir.

"Our goal is to maintain a continuous dialogue with you. By our next meet ing, we will present an action-taken report outlining the progress on issues discussed today," he assured.

Chief Minister Omar Abdullah thanked the participants for accepting his invitation, emphasizing the significance of such meetings for the government authorities to receive valuable feedback from outside four walls of their offices

"Whether you benefit from these meetings or not, my colleagues and I certainly do. These interactions provide us with an opportunity to hear your thoughts on our work and governance directly," he said.

In his closing remarks, Chief Minister expressed gratitude to the participants for their valuable insights and suggestions.

"Your feedback and ground realities help us improve our governance. I hope that when we meet again, you will continue to provide your constructive input to guide us in serving Jammu and Kashmir better," he said.

Ram Rattan. Sunil Sethi said that Hindus in Bangladesh are facing atrociies, they are being killed, and women are being raped. A wave of uncertaint and total insecurity is prevailing there. It is most unfortunate that parties like NC, PDP and even Congress, which project them as champions of human rights, have adopted silence and not showing any sympathy towards the affect ed Hindus in Bangladesh. He said that these parties have double standards even in matters of human rights violations.

"If Hindus are subjected to atrocities and physically assaulted in Bangladesh or elsewhere, none from NC, PDP and Congress condemns the inhumane treatment to the minority community", said Sunil Sethi, adding that selective condemnations by these parties have exposed their anti-Hindu mindset.

Sunil Sethi, while appreciating the united protests and condemnations of Bangladesh incidents by the people of Jammu, belonging to all sections and religions, raised questions for no reaction from Kashmir over the inhumane treatment of Hindus in Bangladesh. He said this speaks of the communal approach of the valley-based parties and people there.

Whereas these parties are making hue and cry over the illegal settlement of Rohingyas and also showing concerns over the distant Israel-Palestine war, these parties are least concerned for the Hindus of Bangladesh which were very part of this nation before partition", he added.

Sunil Sethi, while quoting that during partition of the country in 1947, said there were over 20 per cent Hindus in Pakistan and today they have been reduced to just 2 per cent. Similarly, the number of Hindus in Bangladesh has also come down. This all speaks of the conspiracy to eliminate Hindus, he added. "In India, people of all religions are treated equally, they enjoy freedom of expression, follow their religious practices and all are equal in all matters and at all levels", he said, adding that Hindus from all over the world closely long for help from India. Sethi said that people in Jammu and Kashmir and other parts of the country are minutely watching the anti-Hindu approach of few political parties and would condemn them in the strongest words.
