

Two drug peddlers arrested with Charas, intoxicating tablets

R S PURA: Continuing its drive against drug trafficking and substances abuse under Operation Sanjeevani, R.S Pura Police achieved a major success by recovering 7.78 grams of Charas like substance along with 48 tablets of Clonazepam from two drug peddlers in the area under the jurisdiction of PS R.S Pura.

A Police team of PS R.S.Pura led by SHO PS R.S Pura assisted by Police officials on 17.12.2024 while on routine patrolling, established a naka at Village Banota and rounded up two suspects later identified as Tinku Kumar, son of Tilak Raj, resident of Banota Tehsil RS Pura District Jammu and Sahil Kumar, son of Om Parkash, resident of Banota Tehsil RS Pura District Jammu. During search, 7.78 grams of Charas like substance along with 48 tablets of Clonazepam got recovered from the possession of accused persons.

In this regard, case FIR No. 268/2024 under section 8/20/21/22/29 NDPS Act stands registered at PS R.S Pura and accused persons got arrested, further investigation is underway to uncover the source of the contraband and any potential links to a larger drug network.

4 drug peddlers arrested; psychotropic substances recovered

SRINAGAR: In a relentless efforts to eradicate the menace of drugs, Police have arrested 04 drug peddlers in Srinagar and recovered contraband/psychotropic substances from their possession.

A Police party of PS Kralkhud intercepted a vehicle (Etios) bearing registration number JK01AH-5637 at a checkpoint established at Kralkhud Chowk. The two persons onboard have been identified as Nadeem Shafi Kashani son of Mohd Shafi Kashani resident of Sathoo Payeen Barbarshah and Ashiq Ahmed Hundoo son of Late Gh Rasool Handoo resident of Abi-Karpura Dalgate A/p Hamdania Colony Bemina. During search, 04 grams of Heroin was recovered from their possession. They have been arrested and the vehicle used in the commission of crime has also been seized.

Meanwhile, a Police party of Police Station Safakadal arrested two drug peddlers at a checkpoint established with in their jurisdiction. They have been identified as Nabeel Showkat Zargar son of Showkat Aziz Zargar resident of Safakadal

Haftayarbal and Shahriyar Ahmad Mir son of Mir Ishfaq Ahmad resident of Rathpora Eidgah. During search, 11 bottles of Codeine Phosphate & 30 strips of Tapentidol (banned drugs) have been recovered from their possession.

Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law have been registered at respective police stations and investigations have been initiated.

Burglary case solved within 24 hours, stolen property recovered

SRINAGAR: Srinagar Police solves burglary case within 24 hours and recovers stolen property. On December 17, 2024, taking cognizance of a written complaint by an individual namely Naseer Ah Bhat son of Ghulam Ahmad Bhat resident of Deviahangan Hawal that unknown thieves had broken into his house and stolen various items, including cash, PS Nowhatta registered case FIR No. 57/2024 under relevant sections of law and constituted a Special Investigation Team headed by SHO PS Nowhatta to carry out thorough investigation of the matter.

With swift and strenuous efforts and assistance of human and technical intelligence, the accused persons namely Mohd Shamin Boya son of Mohd Mamoom Boya resident of Ganga Rampur District Ulbarya Kalkata West Bengal and Mohd Sahil Sheikh son of Mohd Sahib Ali Sheikh resident of Ali Pora Narala Sector-8 Delhi were identified and arrested by Srinagar Police.

Pertinently, the stolen property was recovered on December 18, 2024. Further investigation into the case is ongoing.

12 tippers/dumpers seized for transporting mining materials illegally

SRINAGAR: In its untiring efforts to dismantle the network of illegal extraction and transportation of sand and other minerals and dumping of the materials in the preserved marshy and wetlands in Srinagar city, Police have seized twelve tippers/dumpers for carrying illegally extracted minerals, sand, gravel, clay etc.

Police seized 06 tippers bearing registration nos.13B 8562, JK01M 7021, JK04A 2603, JK03G 3175, JK01M 4081, JK01J 3021 that were found involved in the illegal transportation of sand/gravel/clay from different locations of Bemina, Budgam and surrounding areas. Action under Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act has been taken in collaboration with Geology and Mining Department. Pertinently, three tippers have been challaned under the provisions of Motor Vehicles Act for traffic violations.

Similarly, Police Post Qamarwari seized three tippers transporting clay illegally for land filling at Qamarwari which includes tippers bearing registration nos. JK04A 2063 driven by Bilal Ahmad Dar resident of Nasrullahpora, Budgam, JK13A-5790 driven by Ajaz Ahmad Beigh resident of Qadipora, Budgam and JK04B 0876 driven by Mehrajuddin Beigh resident of Qadipora, Budgam. Action under MMDR Act has been taken against these violators.

In another action, Police Station Shalteng seized three heavy vehicles carrying mining materials illegally towards Srinagar which includes vehicles bearing registration nos. JK03D 1146 driven by Basharat Gul resident of Wuyan, JK02AK 2399 driven by Mohd Afzal resident of Summerbugh and JK011 4184 driven by Sajad Ah Dar resident of Pampore. These vehicles were seized and action under MMDR Act has been initiated.

Woman drug peddler booked under PIT NDPS Act

BISHNAH: Acting tough against drug peddlers and to eradicate the menace of drugs from the society, police booked the most wanted woman notorious drug peddler under PIT NDPS Act, in Sub Division R.S.Pura and lodged her in District Jail Udhampur.

The notorious drug smuggler Neelam Devi, wife of Tarsem Lal, resident of Dhinday Khurd, Tehsil Bishnah District Jammu has been booked under PIT NDPS Act after obtaining formal detention orders from the Divisional Commissioner, Jammu. The booked drug smuggler lady has been subsequently lodged in District Jail at Udhampur.

It is pertinent to mention that multiple FIR's under NDPS were registered against the above mentioned drug peddler lady, who was involved in promoting drug trade by supplying drugs to local youths of the area. Despite her arrest in NDPS cases, she did not mend her activities and was again involved in promoting drug abuse trade by supplying drugs to local youth, in order to achieve monetary gains, by wrongful method. The above said notorious drug peddler lady/criminal has remained successful every time in securing the bails from the Courts and in order to refrain the subject lady from indulging in criminal activities, a dossier under stringent PIT NDPS Act was recommended against her; upon which, the Divisional Commissioner, Jammu, after getting satisfied, had issued a PIT NDPS warrant against her.

The arrest was made by a team of PS Bishnah headed by SHO PS Bishnah under the close supervision of SDPO R.S.Pura, SP Hqrs Jammu & overall supervision of SSP Jammu.

Bovine smuggling bid foiled; 4 bovines rescued, vehicle seized

SAMBA: Police foiled bovine smuggling attempt in the jurisdiction of Police Station Ghagwal district Samba, rescued four bovines and seized vehicle used for illegal transportation of bovines. A Police team of Police Station Ghagwal headed by SHO PS Ghagwal while performing vehicle checking duty at Naka Jatwal, intercepted anAutoload carrierbearing registration No. JK02DL-7216 coming from border side for its checking. During checking of the vehicle, four bovines were found laden inside which were tied in a cruel manner and were being transported illegally without any valid permission. All the rescued bovines have been shifted to a safer place.

A case FIR No. 178/2024 U/S 223 BNS 11 PCA Act has been registered at PS Ghagwal and investigation started.

MVD launches special enforcement drive, 40 vehicles Challaned

DODA: The Motor Vehicle Department (MVD) Doda, under the directions of Transport Commissioner Vishesh Paul Mahajan and Deputy Commissioner Doda Harvinder Singh, conducted a rigorous enforcement drive in Doda and Bhaderwah towns. The operation, led by ARTO Rajesh Gupta and a team of MVIs, AMVIs, and Motor Vehicle Traffic Assistants (MVTAs), aimed at curbing traffic violations, particularly those involving bike riders.

During the drive, 200 vehicles were inspected, and 40 were challaned for offenses such as riding without helmets, using mobile phones while driving, and failing to produce valid documents.

Key violations included four cases under Section 194(B) for not wearing helmets, 17 under Section 194(D) for overloading, and seven under Section 3/181 for driving without a valid license. Additionally, four vehicles were seized, and seven driving licenses were recommended for suspension. The total expected e-challan amount is ₹99,500.

Special attention was given to violations that contribute significantly to road accidents, such as underage riding bikes, mobile phone usage while driving, and reckless driving. Officials emphasized that helmet usage is mandatory for both riders and pillion passengers to reduce the risk of fatal injuries. Public awareness was also a focus, with pamphlets distributed to educate citizens on the importance of adhering to traffic rules, carrying valid documents, and avoiding reckless driving.



The authorities reiterated their commitment to strict enforcement of traffic laws to ensure public safety. They emphasized that future drives would prioritize serious violations like mobile usage while driving, drunk driving, rash driving, and operating unfit vehicles. Citizens were urged to cooperate by following traffic rules and adopting responsible driving habits to prevent accidents and ensure safety for all road users.

DC Poonch reviews progress of eKYC for Ration Cards, Food Schemes

POONCH: Deputy Commissioner Poonch, Vikas Kundal on Thursday conducted a comprehensive review of the progress of eKYC of ration cards and other schemes of the Food Civil supplies and consumers affairs department.

Chairing a meeting, the DC sought detailed reports across all schemes. Assistant Director FCS & CA presented an in-depth overview of the department's operations. Key discussion points included the status of stock, supply distribution, grievance redressal mechanisms etc.

The Assistant Director reported that the district maintains sufficient reserves of essential commodities, including wheat, rice, LPG,

petrol, and diesel. To enhance accessibility, the department operates seven stores, 167 fair price shops, and 20 government sale depots for ration distribution.

The Deputy Commissioner focused on the status of e-KYC, NFSA, Non-NFSA, and PMFSS schemes, categorizing them into Non-Priority Households (NPHH), Priority Households (PHH), and Antyodaya Anna Yojana (AAY). He reviewed the challenges faced by Tehsil

Supply Officers (TSOs) across various zones in the district.

Emphasizing the urgency of the eKYC process, the Deputy Commissioner instructed all TSOs to ensure 100% linkage within the current week.

He warned that failure to do so could result in the cancellation of fair price shop licenses. Additionally, he reviewed the status of Aadhaar seeding and discussed the rationalization of manpower, addressing various employee-related issues.

ANNEXURE - 'A'

Eligibility:

A. For Sanginis (Anganwadi Workers)

- The candidate should be a domicile of the UT of J&K.
- Women candidates in the age group of 18-37 years as on 01-01-2024 shall be eligible.
- The candidate should be a resident of the Electoral ward where Anganwadi Centre is situated. Name in the voter list for the ward shall be considered as the proof of residence of the candidate. In case the name of the candidate appears in the voter list along with her parents, then she must provide certificate of being unmarried issued by the concerned Tehsildar. Wherever, there is any dispute as to residence for any reason, then a residence proof certifying the ward of residence from the concerned SDM/ACR shall be considered.
- Minimum qualification for Sangini (Anganwadi Worker) shall be 10+2 and maximum Graduation. In case no 10+2 pass candidate is available in the ward, 10+2 pass candidate from the adjoining ward shall be considered which would require prior approval of Mission Director, Mission Poshan.
- In case suitable candidate is not available from adjoining ward, candidate from the nearest ward within the Panchayat can be considered subject to the approval of the MD, Mission Poshan.
- Weight-age shall be given on the basis of marks obtained in 10+2 and selection shall be done purely on merit basis and not other criteria to be considered.
- In case of tie in merit of the eligible candidate, candidate with higher age will be preferred.
- Candidate with qualification higher than Graduation shall not be considered.
- In case eligible candidate is available within the family of retiring AWWs/AWHs, the said candidate shall qualify for additional two percent points.

B. Sahayikas (Anganwadi Helpers)

- The selection of Helper shall be restricted to the Electoral ward where Anganwadi Centre is located.
- Women candidates in the age group of 18-37 years as on 01-01-2024 shall be eligible.
- The candidate should be a domicile of the UT of J&K.
- Minimum qualification for (Sahayikas) Anganwadi Helper shall be matriculation.
- In case no Matriculate candidate is available in the ward, candidates with qualification not less than 8th standard shall be considered.
- The Committee shall select the most destitute/ needy married woman of the ward as helper from amongst those who fulfill the qualification criteria. In case no married candidate is available, unmarried candidate may be considered.
