## NGFOA calls for two-day mass casual leave from today

JAMMU: Employees of the Jammu and Kashmir Forest Department staged a protest at the Forest Complex Dogra Hall in Jammu, expressing their frustration over the perceived step-motherly treatment by the authorities.

The protest, organized by the All Jammu and Kashmir Non-Gazetted Forest Employees Association (NGFOA), was attended by scores of employees who voiced their concerns regarding several unresolved issues affecting their welfare and working conditions.

One of the primary issues raised by the protesters was the

non-conducting Departmental Promotion Committees (DPCs) in Jammu Province. Employees highlighted that the prolonged delay in conducting DPCs for all cadres has deprived them of timely promotions, causing frustration
