

NGFOA calls for two-day mass casual leave from today

JAMMU: Employees of the Jammu and Kashmir Forest Department staged a protest at the Forest Complex Dogra Hall in Jammu, expressing their frustration over the perceived step-motherly treatment by the authorities.

The protest, organized by the All Jammu and Kashmir Non-Gazetted Forest Employees Association (NGFOA), was attended by scores of employees who voiced their concerns regarding several unresolved issues affecting their welfare and working conditions.

One of the primary issues raised by the protesters was the non-conducting of Departmental Promotion Committees (DPCs) in Jammu Province. Employees highlighted that the prolonged delay in conducting DPCs for all cadres has deprived them of timely promotions, causing frustration

and demoralization among the workforce.

Despite numerous requests from the NGFOA, the authorities have yet to address this long-standing issue.

Another significant concern raised was the reorganization of the Forest Department. Despite several appeals from the NGFOA, the reorganization remains unresolved, leaving employees uncertain about the future structure and functioning of the department.

Additionally, the employees

pointed out the pay anomalies in the Forest Department, where the salary grades for Forest Guards, Revenue Patwaris, and Teachers were initially set at the same level.

Over time, however, Patwaris and Teachers received grade pay increases, while Forest employees have been left behind.

The protestors also expressed their dissatisfaction over the denial of the 2 ½ days salary entitlement, which is granted to other departments despite the

frontline Forest staff working in harsh conditions and often in extreme weather. Furthermore, the employees raised the issue of Risk Allowance, pointing out that the frontline staff frequently face life-threatening situations.

Over 140 employees have tragically lost their lives while on duty, yet they are still deprived of the Risk Allowance that should be granted for the hazardous nature of their work.

Leaders Rajinder Singh Parihar, Gurcharan Singh,

Ghulam Nabi War, and others emphasized the neglect by the authorities.

They stated that the rigid and non-serious attitude of the authorities has forced the employees to take to the streets in protest.

They expressed that despite the immense contributions of the Forest Department employees, their issues have been consistently ignored, and their hard work remains unrecognized.

In response to the authorities' inaction, the NGFOA has called for a two-day mass casual leave on December 27 and 28, 2024, and urged all Forest Department employees to stage protests in their respective office complexes. They also called for continued demonstrations at the Forest Complex, Dogra Hall, Jammu, demanding immediate action and justice for the employees.
