RTO seizes 103 E-Rickshaws for violations in Jammu Distt

JAMMU: In a continued stringent enforcement drive targeting overloading, overcharging, and other major violations under the Motor Vehicles Act and Central Motor Vehicle Rules, the Motor Vehicles Department on Friday conducted a special enforcement drive in Jammu district.

The operation was carried out under direct supervision of Regional Transport Officer Jammu Pankaj Bhagotra in compliance to the special directions issued by Vishesh Mahajan, Transport Commissioner J&K.

The drive was conducted in and around Jammu city and along the Jammu-Srinagar Highway by different teams constituted for the special drive to ensure safety and compliance of Regulations pertaining to e-rickshaws plying within the

The drive was launched following complaints that several erickshaws were being operated without valid driving licenses. During the operation, nearly 475 vehicles were checked for violations like Registration certificate (RC) violations, Overloading of passengers, Over-speeding, Non-compliance with other mandatory regulations.

Out of 450 eRikshaws inspected, 91 e-rickshaw were seized and a fine totaling \$2,30,000 (Rupees Two lakh thirty thousand) was imposed.

The Officials informed that MVD is committed to ensuring safety and responsible operation of all the vehicles within its jurisdiction including e-rickshaw. They further added that such drives will continue in future and all the violators are warned to strictly follow rules otherwise more harsh actions

The team also educated e-rickshaw drivers that e-rickshaw is meant for last mile connectivity and prohibited to ply on National Highways and other main roads as per the objective of their introduction in the transport system.

Known for his involvement in multiple fraudulent activities, Bilal Ahmad Lone has caused significant public distress.

4 drug peddlers arrested state times news

SRINAGAR/KULGAM: Continuing its efforts to eradicate the menace of drugs from the society, Police have arrested three drug peddlers in Srinagar & Kulgam and recovered contraband substances from their possession.

During patrolling by team of Police Station Bemina on link road between Bemina and Ibrahim Colony, a vehicle bearing registration number MH02ER/9763 (Etios) parked under suspicious circumstances by the road side was noticed. Upon approaching the vehicle, two persons on board attempted to flee, but were apprehended tactfully by the police team During search, 7.10gms of brown sugar-like substance was recovered from their possession. The two persons disclosed their identity as Syed Athar Rafi son of Syed Rafi Ahmed resident of Dehraman Soibugh Badgam A/P Usmania Colony Bemina and Waseem Ahmed Rather son of Mohd Ashraf Rather resident of Hamdaniya colony Bemina.

In this connection, a case FIR No 81/24 under relevant sec tions of NDPS Act has been registered in Police Station Bemina and investigation has been taken up. Both the accused persons have been arrested and vehicle used in the commission of crime has also been seized.

Meanwhile, In Kulgam a police party of Police Station Qaimoh at a checkpoint established at Khudwani Byepass-NHW intercepted a suspicious person carrying a bag. During search, 4 Kgs of Poppy Straw like contraband substance con cealed in the said bag was recovered. He has been identified as Raj Kumar son of Meer Chand resident of Batote Rambar and was subsequently arrested on the spot. Accordingly, a case vide FIR no 109/2024 under section 8/15 NDPS Act stands registered at Police Station Qaimoh and investigation has been taken up.

A Police party of Police Post Mirgund headed by IC PP Mirgund at a checkpoint established at Parihaspora-Diwer Crossing Pattan, intercepted one person who has been identi fied as Syed Akhter Shah son of Syed Mustafa Shah resident of Diwer Pattan.
