CM Yogi reviews police construction projects

LUCKNOW: UP Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has stressed the importance of timely and high-quality completion of police infrastructure projects.

During a review meeting on Thursday, he directed regular assessments of residential and non-residential buildings being developed for police lines, transit hostels, and training institutes the Home Department.

Weekly reviews by a Secretary-level officer and fortnightly monitoring by Additional Chief dated, along with oversight by district, range, and zonal police officers.

CM Yogi Adityanath emphasized that project designs must remain unchanged after construction begins unless prior government approval is obtained. He also mandated installing lifts in all multistory buildings and proposed a dedicated fund for their maintenance.

For projects exceeding Rs 50 crore, the Chief Minister ordered monthly thirdparty audits by technical institutes. These institutes



must provide detailed onsite verification reports, including photographs, to transparency. Highlighting the need for expertise, he suggested hiring retired professionals or experts from reputable institutions to address the shortage of skilled engineers in construction agen-

Reviewing the zone-wise budget and construction progress, the Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath prioritized adequate residential facilities for police personnel.

Multi-story housing projects are being developed within police lines to address this need. He noted that eight districts, including Sambhal, Hapur, and Amroha, lack permanent police lines, and their ongoing construction will enhance operational effi-
