




Javed Rana reviews development projects in Rajouri; announces key initiatives for water, tribal welfare

RAJOURI: Minister for Jal Shakti, Forest, Ecology & Environment, and Tribal Affairs, Javed Ahmed Rana, on Saturday chaired a review meeting with officers from all departments held at Rajouri to assess progress on development projects and tribal welfare schemes being implemented in the district.

Deputy Commissioner Rajouri, Abhishek Sharma, briefed the meeting regarding the status of various developmental initiatives being implemented under central and UT sponsored welfare schemes.

The meeting covered a wide range of issues including Rural Development, Power, Public Works, PMGSY, Jal Jeevan Mission,



Irrigation and Flood Control, upgradation of education and health infrastructure, Cluster Tribal Model Villages, forestry and wildlife, tribal welfare schemes, industries and other social sector programs.

The Minister stressed the importance of ensuring quality in developmental works, improving work culture while upholding high standards of workmanship.

He asked the Deputy Commissioner to identify state land for creating a land bank to facilitate plantations under the Forest Department, particularly as a compensatory measure for projects in forested areas.

Javed Rana instructed for installation of handpumps on community basis instead of individual setups. He announced provision of two water

tankers per constituency in Rajouri district to address water scarcity in deficit villages.

The Minister directed for preparation of Detailed Project Reports (DPRs) worth Rs 10 crore per constituency for soil conservation under convergence with MGNREGA, IWMP, and Irrigation and Fisheries Department to enhance water recharge and raise the water table. He emphasised incorporating projects under the "Dharti Aabha" initiative to enhance education infrastructure and road connectivity.

Javed Rana highlighted that all villages in Rajouri have been included in tribal welfare schemes, ensuring extensive benefits for the tribal population.

MLAs from Rajouri, Budhal, Kalakote, and Thanamandi constituencies besides DDC Chairperson Adv Naseem Liaquat, raised key issues pertaining to their regions.

The Minister assured them of timely resolution of their issues and concerns while reiterating government's commitment towards meeting public aspirations and prioritising the needs of public representatives.

The meeting was attended by DDC Chairperson, Adv Naseem Liaquat, MLA Budhal Javed Iqbal Choudhary, MLA Kalakote, Thakur Randeer Singh, MLA Thanamandi, Muzaffar Khan and MLA Rajouri Iftikhar Ahmed, ADDC Rajouri, Dr Raj Kumar Thapa and other district and sectoral officers.

Harneek Singh Murder Case: 3 accused found guilty

JAMMU: The 2nd Additional Sessions Judge, Jammu, has found three accused guilty in Harneek Singh murder case, which took place on January 8, 2014, near Railway Patri, Tali Morh in R.S. Pura.

The accused, Harvinder Singh, Harcharan Singh, and Amarjeet Singh, all sons of Lakhmir Singh, residents of Railway Patri, Tali Morh, Tehsil R.S. Pura, were charged under several sections, including 302 (Murder), 307 (Attempted Murder), 427 (Mischievous), 324 (Voluntarily Causing Hurt), 120-B (Criminal Conspiracy), 34 (Common Intention) of the Arms Act.

Arguments on quantum of punishment on Dec 30

According to the prosecution, the incident occurred around 8:30 PM on Jan 8, 2014 when the complainant Avtar Singh and his friend Harneek Singh were returning home in an Alto car. The accused were already present near the street in a truck, armed with deadly weapons. They attacked Avtar Singh first, damaging the car's windscreen with a baseball bat. The situation escalated when Harcharan Singh dragged Avtar out of the car, while Harvinder Singh attacked him with a kirch (a traditional weapon), causing injuries to his abdomen.

Simultaneously, the accused dragged Harneek Singh from the vehicle, and Harvinder Singh struck him repeatedly with the kirch, leading to his death on the spot.

Despite the serious charges, the accused denied the allegations, and no defence witnesses were produced in the case. The accused were tried in a Sessions Court, where charges were framed on August 25, 2014.

After a thorough examination of the evidence, the court found all three accused guilty of murder (Section 302) and attempted murder (Section 307).

The court also held Harvinder Singh guilty under Section 4/25 of the Arms Act for possessing and using the weapon, and Amarjeet Singh guilty of mischief under Section 427 of RPC for damaging the vehicle.

The judge, Amit Sharma, announced the verdict in an

open court in the virtual presence of the accused, who appeared from Central Jail Kot Bhalwal, Jammu. The State was represented by Arvind Rathore, Additional Public Prosecutor, while Sunil Sethi and Associates defended the accused.

The accused have been held guilty, and the court will hear arguments on the quantum of punishment on December 30, 2024. The judgment was announced in a virtual session, with the accused given a free copy of the verdict. This marks a significant step in the judicial process as the case progresses to sentencing.

possession is mentioned below. Upon preliminary questioning, they disclosed that they are terror associates of the banned outfit LeT, working for a Pakistani terrorist of LeT who is active in District Srinagar and other areas.

They further revealed that, under a well-planned criminal conspiracy; they intended to use these arms and ammunition against police, security forces, non-locals, tourists, political leaders etc to disrupt peace and tranquility in the valley. Accordingly, Case FIR No. 31/2024 under Sections 7/25 of the Indian Arms Act, and Sections 13, 18, 20, 23, 38, and 39 of the UA(P) Act has been registered at Police Station Khanyar, and the investigation has commenced.

Special Judge NIA Srinagar Majeet Rai after hearing both the sides observed that the accused is allegedly involved in commission of offences under sections U/S 7/25 A Act, 13, 18, 20, 23, 38, 39 UA (P) Act.

The offences under the UA(P) Act involve activities prejudicial to the sovereignty, integrity, and security of the state.

The seriousness of the allegations and the potential impact on public peace weigh heavily against the grant of bail. The police report details recoveries from the accused, including a Chinese grenade and mobile phones linked to terrorist activities.

Court rejects bail application of LeT OGW

JAMMU: Special Judge NIA Srinagar Majeet Rai rejected the bail application of one Umer Asif Zarger an alleged over ground worker of LeT.

According to the police case that on August 8, 2024, at approximately 2305 hours, Police Station Khanyar received a written report from the SHO PS Khanyar stating that, while conducting foot and vehicle patrols in preparation for the forthcoming 15th August Independence Day, he, along with escort personnel, SDO Column, SP Column, PC Srinagar personnel, and Valley QRT CRPF, observed suspicious activity near the STP at Munwarabad.

The SHO P/S Khanyar and the party, having noticed unusual light in the bushes, immediately cordoned off the area. Upon attempting to flee, 04 suspects were apprehended.

They disclosed their identities as Imran Ahmad Mir, son of Ghulam Qadir Mir, resident of Ranghamam Nowhatta, Muzamil Khurshid Wani, son of Khurshid Ahmad Wani, resident of Narparistan Rithehkalad at present Beerni Kathi Darvazar, Umar Asif Zargar, son of Gh. Mohammad Zargar, resident of Chota Bazar Kanikadal, Qazi Usman, son of Qazi Muzaffar, resident of Hoka Bazar Nowhatta.

Upon personal search Arms and ammunition and other materials recovered from their

Preliminary investigation points to the accused's role as an active terror associate. The prosecution has presented sufficient material at this stage to establish a reasonable link between the accused and the unlawful activities. Under Section 43D(5) of the UA(P) Act, bail cannot be granted if the court is satisfied, on a prima facie basis, that the accusations are true. Based on the available evidence, this court finds that the threshold for denying bail under this provision is met.
