Another ,critical condition is congenital coronary artery anomalies, where abnormal coronary artery development can restrict blood flow dur-

He elaborated that Electrical abnormalities, such as long QT syndrome and Wolff-Parkinson-White (WPW) syndrome, disrupt the heart's normal rhythm, increasing the risk of lifethreatening arrhythmias. Additionally, myocarditis, an inflammation of the heart muscle often caused by viral infections, can lead to sudden cardiac events, especially during intense physical activity. While these conditions can be asymptomatic, they may also manifest as warning signs, including

chest pain, fainting, or palpitations during exercise. Participation in sports offers young athletes numerous physical, mental, and social benefits. However, underlying heart conditions can pose significant risks, potentially leading to serious outcomes like sudden cardiac arrest (SCA). While these events are rare, prevention and early detection are essential to ensuring the safety of

He added that the first line of defense against heartrelated issues in young athletes is a thorough pre participation screening.
