return. It is their decision when they want to return. Our hearts are open for them. Even when I was the chief minister, when the situation was bad, we tried to bring them back," he said. On demands seeking review of the reservation policy in Jammu and Kashmir, Abdullah said the government should review the same. "We will tell the government to review it. Reservation is for the underprivileged sections so that they can come up as equals," he said. The NC government has formed a Cabinet sub-committee to look into the demands for rationalisation of reservations, which have gone up to 70 per cent in the Union Territory. On Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha last week firing two government employees for their alleged terror links, Abdullah said the government "will keep an eye on everything and go into why the two employees were terminated". The veteran politician also welcomed the Israel-Lebanon 'ceasefire', but called for an end to attacks on Gaza, Syria and Iran as well. "It (ceasefire) is a very good step, but it is necessary to stop attacks jointly being carried out by Israel and America -- in Gaza, Syria and Iran, which are continuing even today. This is dangerous. They should immediately resort to ceasefire. "You must have watched the debates in the (UN) Security Council. If there is a purpose for (the existence of) Security Council, it should work on the directions given to Israel. They should enforce a ceasefire and allow humanitarian aid," Abdullah said. On his recent religious pilgrimage, Abdullah said he not only prayed for Kashmir, but for the entire Muslim world. "The problems we are facing today, may Allah deliver us from these. May Allah guide us to the right path. I prayed that we stay away from evil and for the end of religious hatred that has spread in our country. I prayed for unity and harmony," he said.

## CB files final charge-sheet in multi-crore misappropriation case

JAMMU: Crime Branch has filed final charge-sheet in multi-crore misappropriation case of Jamkash Vehicleleads Channi before the Court of Law for judicial determination after effecting recovery of whole misappropriated amount and completing the investigation.

"On July 19, 2022, a case FIR No. 118/2022 under Sections 420, 406, 408, 109 IPC was registered at Police Station Channi Himmat Jammu on the written complaint of Executive Director Jamkash Vehicleleads Pvt. Ltd. to the effect that the accused Sheraz Mir, son of Mohd. Bashir, resident of Shant Nagar, Janipur, Jammu, then working as Accountant of Jamkash Vehicleleads had committed criminal breach of trust and cheating by transferring huge amount to the tune of Rs. 1.32 crores in his own bank accounts from the funds of Jamkash Vehicleleads Pvt. Ltd and further invested the same amount for online betting." Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Crime Jammu, Benam Tosh said. He added that accused Sheraz Mir was arrested, about Rs 22 lakh misappropriated amount was recovered and preliminary charge-sheet against the accused was filed by District Police in the court of law for judicial determination.

"As a huge recovery of misappropriated amount was yet to be made, PHQ J&K on July 13, 2023, transferred the instant case to Crime Branch (EOW) Jammu for in-depth investigation and accordingly CB started thorough probe." SSP said adding that the investigation of the case was speeded up and Crime Branch thoroughly analysed the suspected bank accounts of the accused.

"Soon after further clues struck, CB team conducted raids at several premises in Indore and Delhi and succeeded in recovering entire remaining misappropriated amount to the tune of Rs 1.10 crore which is a major achievement on the part of CB. Thus, whole amount misappropriated by the accused Le Rs 1.32 crore has been recovered and received by the complainant," SSP Crime Branch said. Benam Tosh congratulated the investigating team for commendable work done by making recovery of whole misappropriated amount and completing the investigation in time-bound manner.

SSP further confirmed that final chargesheet in case FIR No. 118/2022 under Sections 406, 408 IPC has been filed by Crime Branch (EOW) Jammu before Court of Special Mobile Magistrate Passenger Tax Shops & Estb. Act Jammu for judicial determination and whole misappropriated amount to the tune of Rs 1.32 crore has been recovered from the accused which has been handed over to the complainant following proper legal procedure.

Bund, a Police team arrested a drug peddler identified as Abid Ahmad Bhat son of Ghulam Rasool Bhat resident of Sozeith Goripora. During search, 430 grams of Charas and 750 grams of Bhang Powder concealed in a polythene bag was recovered from his possession.

Regarding the incidents, cases under relevant sections of law have been registered at respective police stations and investigations have been taken up.

Police in Sopore have arrested a drug peddler and recovered Psychotropic Substances from his possession.

A Police party of PS Tarzoo, at a checkpoint established near Sanctorum Public School Lalad Sopore, arrested a drug peddler identified as Tawheed Nabi Gojri son of Ghulam Nabi Gojri resident of Peth Seer Sopore. During search, Police team was able to recover 312 capsules of SpasnoProxyvon Plus from his possession.

Accordingly, a case under relevant sections of law has been registered at Police Station Tarzoo & investigation has been initiated.

## Property of notorious drug peddler attached

KUPWARA: In a significant crackdown on drug trafficking, Police in Kupwara have attached the residential house of Lateef Ahmad Chouhan son of Jalal Din Chouhan resident of Surigam Lolab. The action was taken under Section 68(F) of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985 (NDPS).

## Two narco smugglers nabbed with heroin

JAMMU: Bakshi Nagar police with a clear stance of zero tolerance to Drugs abuse arrested another drug peddler Karamjeet Singh alias Chamkor, son of Manjeet Singh, resident of Indra Nagar Miran Sahab Jammu when the suspected Maruti Ciaz with Delhi based no, DL 6CQ 2534 without HSR number was intercepted at Bakshi Nagar.

Karamjeet tried to run away leaving his car behind. Active police party at the Nakka apprehended him and during search 8 gm Heroin/Chitta was found from his possession.

On further enquiry, it came to fore that the said accused is selling narcotics from last many years for undue profit generation in the local area. In this regard FIR No,160/2024 stand registered at Police Station Bakshi Nagar and investigation is in full swing.

Miran Sahib Police also apprehended a drug peddler and recovered 3 grams of heroin-like substance (chitta) from his possession.

During routine patrolling near Bagh-e-Bhour Park, Indira Nagar, the alert police team noticed a suspicious pedestrian attempting to evade checking. The police acted swiftly and detained the individual, who was later identified as Mohd, Shafi, resident of Indira Nagar, Miran Sahib. Upon conducting a personal search, 3 grams of heroin-like substance were recovered from his possession.

Following this, an FIR under relevant sections of the NDPS Act (FIR No,118/2024) was registered, and further investigation is underway to uncover possible links to larger drug networks.

## Bootlegger arrested with 480 bottles of illicit liquor

SAMBA: Intensifying its drive against the sale of illicit liquor, J&K Police has arrested a bootlegger and recovered four hundred eighty bottles of illicit liquor of 180 ml each from his possession in the jurisdiction of Police Station Ramgarh.

Acting on a reliable information about sale of illicit liquor in Rara area, a police party of Police Station Ramgarh headed by SHO PS Ramgarh rushed to the spot and caught red-handed the accused person from his own shop selling illicit liquor to the general public in the area and recovered 480 bottles of JK Special Whisky of 180 ml each from his possession.

The accused person identified as Jaswinder Singh, son of Shamsheer Singh, resident of Rara, tehsil Ramgarh district Samba has been arrested.

A case FIR No,112/2024 u/s 48 (f) Excise Act has been registered against him in Police Station Ramgarh and investigation started.

## Drug peddler nabbed with 2.6 Kgs Charas

RAMBAN: Continuing its fight against the menace of drugs, the Ramban Police, today recovered a commercial quantity of contraband Charas from an individual in the Ramban area.

While conducting routine checks, a police party from the Police Station Ramban noticed a pedestrian walking from Kanthi towards Ramban. Upon reaching Samadhi Morh Kanthi, the individual attempted to flee upon seeing the police checkpoint. The police party tactically apprehended the person, who was identified as Surjeet Singh, son of Beer Singh, resident of Kharkoni Damote, Tehsil and District Ramban. Upon further questioning, he became visibly perplexed.

During a subsequent search, a black polythene bag was discovered containing small balls of a substance resembling charas, which were packed in a transparent polythene bag. Upon counting, a total of 51 balls weighing 2.638 Kgs of the charas-like substance were found.

In this regard, Case FIR No,279/2024 under Section 8/20 of the NDPS Act has been registered at the Police Station Ramban. The accused has been taken into custody, and the contraband has been seized. Investigations are currently underway to explore any connections or networks associated with this illegal activity.
