22 terrorists, six soldiers killed during security operations in NW Pakistan AGENCY

PESHAWAR: At least 22 terrorists were eliminated while six soldiers were killed during three separate operations over two days in Pakhtunkhwa Khyber province in northwestern Pakistan, media wing of the army said on Saturday.

intelligence-based operations (IBO) took place in Khyber Pukhtunkhwa's Tank, North Waziristan, and districts December 6 to 7, the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) said.

In Tank district, the troops effectively engaged the terrorists' location in Gul Imam area on the reported presence of terrorists resulting in the death of nine terrorists while six were injured.

At least 10 terrorists were successfully neutralised in North Waziristan while in the third encounter, as per the ISPR, the security forces thwarted terrorists' attempt to attack a check post in Thall district during which three terrorists were killed ■ CONTD ON PAGE 9

Water supply will not be snapped to Rohingyas living in Jammu: Javed Rana

JAMMU: Amid an ongoing drive against Rohingya Muslims here, Jammu and Kashmir Jal Shakti Minister Javed Ahmed Rana on Saturday said the water supply will not be snapped to the slums housing the illegal immigrants, pending a call from the Centre on their

deportation. Rana's statement came after Rohingyas living on three plots of land in Narwal area of Jammu claimed that their power and water supply was snapped recently by the

ettlement of illegal immigrants-Rohingyas-- in DJammu is a very serious issue, having ramifications on national security as also the social-fabric of the City of Temples due to fast changing demography. A local English daily has reported "... while police have identified some Non-Governmental Organisations (NGO's) who have intentionally been facilitating movement of the Myanamarese from across India to Jammu with a view to change demography of the region." STATE TIMES had flagged this alarming issue in its anchor story by Dost Khan under title 'For being secular, Jammu was rewarded with Rohingya settlements' on February 21,

STATE TIMES had reported the admission by a senior Congress leader and former minister from Jammu that he was instructed by a Muslim leader from the All India Congress Committee, who was also a Union Minister, to facilitate the settlement of Rohingyas in

STATE TIMES had also questioned the intent behind Rohingyas settlement in the Hindu dominated Jammu instead of Muslim majority Kashmir-the entire Valley.

Government of India takes a call on their issue," Rana, who is also minister for forest, ecology and environment, and tribal affairs, told

The minister said he will take up the disconnection issue with the officials.

"Water cannot be stopped to anyone, it is the requirement of all living beings," the minister said, expressing surprise over the alleged snapping of water supply to a few plots housing Rohingyas by the department.

According to government data, more than 13,700 foreigners, most of them Rohingyas (illegal immigrants from Myanmar) and Bangladeshi nationals, are settled in Jammu and other districts of Jammu and

Kashmir, where their population increased by over 6,000 between 2008 and 2016. In March 2021, police

found over 270 Rohingyas, including women and children, living illegally in Jammu city during a verification drive and lodged them in a holding centre inside the Kathua sub-jail.

On November 25, Senior Superintendent of Police. South Jammu, Ajay Sharma said a total of 18 FIRs were registered in a major drive against the landlords renting out their properties to Rohingyas and other illegal immigrants without providing information to police as per the order of district magistrate. "The civil administration has also
