JAMMU: The Gharana Wetland Conservation Reserve in R.S. Pura, Jammu, has witnessed a remarkable ecological resurgence, transforming it into one of Northern India's most vibrant wintering habitats for migratory waterbirds. Following a series of scientific restoration interventions executed by the Department of Wildlife Protection, Jammu & Kashmir, the wetland now attracts thousands of waterfowl arriving each winter from Siberia and Central Asia.

Notified as a Conservation Reserve in 1991 and spread across 408 kanals, Gharana Wetland has long been a significant stopover for migratory species. However, recent years have seen the wetland undergo comprehensive rejuvenation under an approved manage-



profile, expanded its foraging grounds, and improved its water-holding capacity. To further strengthen protec-

tion, the department has

installed chain-link fencing around the site, successfully curbing livestock intrusion, human interference, and poaching threats. These interventions have created a safe. undisturbed ecological zone conducive to feeding, roosting and breeding activities of numerous wintering species, including several categorised

Endangered Threatened by the IUCN.

With the onset of the current migratory season, wildlife officials and independent birdwatchers have recorded a significant rise in both the diversity and population of visiting waterbirds. Regular census teams report manifold increases in bird activity, with flocks now covering a larger expanse of the wetland than seen in previous years. Key species observed in high numbers include the Bar-headed Goose. Northern Pintail, Common Teal, Eurasian Wigeon, Gadwall, Black-winged Stilt and Red-wattled Lapwing.

"Timely scientific interventions, improved habitat quality and sustained management efforts have catalysed Gharana's rapid ecological recovery," a senior wildlife offi-

cer said. "The resurgence of open water zones and improved natural food availability have considerably enhanced bird presence and diversity."

The wetland is also witnessing a surge in visits by researchers, nature enthusiasts, students and wildlife photographers, contributing to its growing relevance as a centre for eco-tourism and environmental learning.

Strategically located along the Central Asian Flyway - one of the world's major migratory bird routes - Gharana Wetland now meets key criteria for inclusion under the prestigious Ramsar Convention. Officials believe that the site's strengthened ecological profile significantly boosts its prospects for attaining Ramsar site recogni-


