

Various delegations meet Pawan Khajuria, apprise of their problems

UDHAMPUR: At the office located near Sailan Talab, Udhampur, delegations from the Satredi, Soondla, Neeli, Balpur and other areas of Majalta Tehsil in the Udhampur East Assembly Constituency met Pawan Khajuria and informed apprise him about their problems.

On this occasion, the delegation from a village in Majalta, said that although 78 years have passed since the country gained independence and under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi the country is touching new heights in every field and has become the world's fourth-largest economy, but many parts of Jammu & Kashmir still need improvement. Speaking specifically about Majalta Tehsil, they said that there are several areas where development work is progressing at a

very slow pace.

Talking about their own village, they informed Pawan Khajuria that there is lack of many basic facilities. The middle school is not being upgraded, and the high school that exist are far away from their reach. Because of the long distance to the high school, many girl students are unable to complete their education.

They further said that although the number of children in schools is increasing, the number of teachers

has decreased.

Discussing issues related to their land, they said that the schemes of the Agriculture Department hardly reach them. If a farmer wants to grow vegetables in his fields to earn a livelihood, there is no arrangement for water. They said that even drinking water has to be carried from far-off places, and in areas where drinking water itself is difficult to obtain, growing vegetables is nothing short of a dream.

Another delegation expressed concern about the condition of the roads. They said that for the last ten years the roads have been in terrible shape. Even if tar is laid on some roads occasionally, due to the negligence of public representatives and the poor quality work of the contractors, it does not last for more than one or two months.

Another delegation revealed the poor condition of electricity supply. They said that several electric

poles damaged during the recent heavy rains have still not been repaired. And where electricity is available, if one has to shine a torch on a bulb at night to see whether it is glowing, then what is the use of such an electricity supply? Children somehow manage to study during the day, but studying at night becomes extremely difficult.

Pawan Khajuria listened to everyone's problems seriously and assured them that he would meet the District Commissioner and bring all these issues to his notice.

He also urged all the delegations to keep a close watch on any development work taking place in their respective areas, and if they notice any compromise in quality, they should immediately inform him so that he can speak to the concerned departmental officials and put a stop to any arbitrary actions by the contractor.

In the aftermath of the May operations, Yuva Unstoppable, in collaboration with ARCIL and with the active support of the Indian Army, undertook a large-scale relief mission to reach some of the most inaccessible and operationally sensitive hamlets along the Poonch border belt. At a time when connectivity was fragile and supply chains were disrupted, the initiative brought timely assistance to families living in extreme hardship. Under

the Indian Army played a crucial role in ensuring the safe and timely delivery of relief material, navigating difficult routes to reach every identified family.

Today, in December, the impact of that effort is still visible. Residents across forward villages recall how the relief drive helped them bridge a difficult period and restored a sense of dignity and hope when uncertainty was at its peak. Community elders and local representatives continue to acknowledge the role of the NGO and its partners in standing by them when support was most needed. Senior repre-

sentatives of ARCIL and Yuva Unstoppable had then described the initiative as more than a relief drive, calling it a moral responsibility to stand beside the nation's border communities. Their words, echoed by grateful beneficiaries months later, underline the enduring value of timely humanitarian action.

The initiative stands as a powerful example of collaboration between civil society, corporate responsibility and the armed forces, demonstrating that meaningful service leaves an impression far beyond the moment of action.

from Cyber Police Station Doda delivered detailed lectures, educating the participants about:

Use of cybercrime reporting portals, CEIR Portal for reporting stolen/missing mobile phones, Latest modus operandi adopted by fraudsters to deceive the public, Online financial frauds including credit card fraud, OTP frauds, QR code scam, and fraudulent loan assurances

Participants were advised

to keep their social media accounts secure, avoid interacting with unknown individuals on platforms like Facebook, WhatsApp, Instagram, Twitter, etc., and adopt safe online practices.

It is pertinent to mention that Cyber Awareness Programmes are regularly organized by J&K Police to spread awareness about cybercrimes, online frauds, and cheating, ensuring that the general public remains alert and does not fall victim to cyber fraudsters.

CBI files charge sheet against 30 people, including two Chinese nationals, in Rs 1,000 crore cyber scam case

DELHI: The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) has filed a charge sheet against 27 people, including two Chinese nationals and three companies, in the HPZ Token Investment Fraud case. It is alleged that Shigoo Technology Private Limited, an entity owned and controlled by Chinese nationals, collected hundreds of crores through a mobile application called "HPZ Tokens", over just three months during the COVID-19 lockdown. The application offered huge returns on investments in cryptocurren-

cy mining.

The "syndicate" members set up shell companies, whose bank accounts were used to move over Rs 1,000 crore within a few months.

The CBI said the scam was not an isolated incident but part of a "large and well-coordinated" cyber-crime network operated by foreign nationals. "This syndicate was responsible for several cyber scams targeting Indian citizens in the post-COVID period using loan apps, fake investment

apps and platforms offering bogus online job offers," CBI charge sheet said.

The agency initially arrested six persons: Mr. Dortse, Rajni Kohli, Sushanta Behra, Abhishek, Mohammed Imdhad Husain, and Rajat Jain, and has now filed a charge sheet against 30 accused, including two Chinese nationals named Wan Jun and Li Anming, who allegedly played key roles in directing the operations.

"Wan Jun was the director of Jilian Consultants India Private Limited, which was a subsidiary of a Chinese entity, Jilian Consultants. Ms. Wan Jun, with the help of one Mr. Dortse, created several shell companies, including Shigoo Technologies. Investigation has revealed that these shell companies became the conduit to collect and launder the proceeds of crime of major organised cyber frauds," the agency said.

These cyber scams were connected and controlled by a single organised criminal syndicate based overseas. According to the CBI, there was a highly sophisticated
