JAMMU: Justice Sanjay Dhar of the HC of J&K and Ladakh has directed the Director General of Police (DGP), J&K, to identify the ACB/Police Station authorities legally competent to investigate cases under the Prevention of Corruption Act. The Court also ordered the appointment of a senior police officer of the rank of Superintendent of Police (SP) or above to examine Police Station whether Qazikund has jurisdiction to enquire into anti-corruption matters. The order was passed in a petition filed by Amandeep Singh, Inspector, Anti-Narcotics Task Force (ANTF), seeking quashing of FIR No. 186/2024 registered at Police Station Qazikund. Singh is the Investigating Officer in NDPS FIR No. 13/2024 involving offences under the NDPS Act, forgery, fraud and use of forged documents. The prime accused in the NDPS case, Ashraf Dar, had lodged FIR No. 186/2024 against the petitioner, allegedly as a counterblast. Appearing for the petitioner, Advocate A.K. Sawhney, assisted by Advocates M. Kashif Malik and Anil Kumar, argued that Police Station Qaziqund is not among the eight notified Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB)

SC grants interim bail to Bijbehara man re-incarcerated 19 years after acquittal

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court granted interim bail to Sabzar Ahmad Sofi of Bijbehara, Anantnag, who was taken into custody nearly 19 years after his acquittal was overturned by the J&K HC. Sofi had originally been acquitted on 5 March 2005 by the Sessions Court, Anantnag, in a case related to a 2001 incident stemming from an irrigation dispute. The trial court had found major contradictions in witness testimonies and noted the lack of reliable corroboration, concluding that the prosecution had failed to prove its case. The State filed an appeal in 2006, but it remained pending for almost two decades. On 30 July 2025, the HC reversed the acquittal, convicted Sofi under Section 304 Part II RPC, and sentenced him to five years' imprisonment. Before the Supreme Court, Sofi's legal team-led by Senior Advocate Shadan Farasatchallenged the prolonged delay. They also pointed to inconsistencies in the prosecution's key witness statements regarding the alleged weapon. The SC issued notice on the plea and granted interim bail, allowing Sofi to remain free while the case proceeds.
