10.42, Girls Primary School, Ratnal costing 10.42, High School, Kotli Fateh Mian costing 36.00, Higher Secondary School Rehal Damalia costing 36.00, Middle School Bishnah, W.No.7 costing 20.84, Middle School, Kotli Charkan costing 20.84, Middle School, Sohagpur costing Girls Middle 10.42.School, Brij Nagar costing 20.84, High School, Brij Nagar costing 54.00, High School. Girls Nougran costing 18.00, Girls Primary School Joian costing 10.42 and Primary School, Kothey Hoshiaru costing 10.42.
