

Sat raises alarming climatic challenges of J&K in RS, seeks immediate financial, technical support from Centre

NEW DELHI: Rajya Sabha MP and J&K BJP President Sat Sharma today highlighted the grave climatic challenges confronting Jammu & Kashmir during the Zero Hour in the Upper House. Expressing deep concern over the region's growing vulnerability to extreme weather conditions, he urged the Central Government to extend enhanced financial and technical assistance to enable the Union Territory to effectively tackle natural disasters. Sharma noted that Jammu & Kashmir is experiencing visible and worrying shifts in climate patterns, including rising temperatures, erratic rainfall. and a surge in cloudbursts, flash floods, and landslides. Citing the recent flash flood in the Chashoti area of Padar in Kishtwar district-which led to loss of lives and property-he stressed the urgent need for scientific interventions and preventive strategies to avert such tragedies in the future. While acknowledging the significance of national initiatives such as the

National Action Plan on Climate Change (NAPCC) and the National Adaptation Fund for Climate Change (NAFCC), Sharma said that



sustained Central support.

He called for advanced resources to implement climate-resilient measures tailored to the region's unique topography and ecological sensitivity. Emphasizing the need to strengthen monitoring capabilities, Sharma urged the Government of India to upgrade climate-monitoring and early-warning systems in vulnerable areas. He sought the deployment of Doppler Radar systems, satellite-based surveillance, and ground sensor networks to improve atmospheric monitoring and ensure timely alerts, which he stressed would

significantly reduce damage to life and infrastructure during emergencies. Addressing the gathering, Ganesh Khajuria emphasised that while the teaching community respects all decisions of the Apex Court and institutions of law, the future of millions of students cannot be compromised. He stated that teachers are already overburdened with nonteaching duties such as election work, surveys, census assignments, and management of mid-day meals. Adding another responsibility unrelated to education, he warned, would further diminish classroom teaching time and hamper academic out-

comes. Khajuria urged the Government to review the decision and exempt teaching staff from being appointed as Nodal Officers for stray dog monitoring. He recommended that the responsibility be handed over to concerned agencies such as the Wildlife Department, Corporations, Municipal Committees, Panchavats. with support from the Animal Husbandry and Health Departments, alongside law enforcement agen-

strongly advocated restricting teachers strictly to teaching duties, cautioning that if such burdensome non-teaching assignments continue, the teaching fraternity may be compelled to initiate a decisive struggle to protect the academic environment of government schools.
