## Bus driver booked for dangerous driving

JAMMU: Traffic Police Rural Jammu has taken strict action against a driver after his recent video surfaced on social media showing a passenger bus being driven by him in a dangerous and reckless manner creating panic among the general public. The driver was seen repeatedly withdrawing his hands off the steering wheel and dancing while driving, a Bus reportedly carrying students on picnic over Mughal Road near

Taking prompt cognizance of the matter, SSP Traffic Rural Jammu got an enquiry conducted through DTI Poonch during which the details of the vehicle and identity of the driver involved in stunt driving were established. Consequently, action U/S 3/181/184/207 M V Act was taken by Traffic Police Rural Jammu and Bus bearing Regd. No JK12C-9247 was also seized for offences which mainly included dangerous driving. The findings were also shared with SSP Poonch who directed immediate registration of Case FIR No 284/2025 U/S 281/125 BNS read with 184 M V Act at Police Station Surankot. The driver of the Bus has been identified as Ramzan Ali @ Chuni S/O Mohd Bashir R/O Dhargloon Tehsil Mendhar District Poonch who has been arrested for further investigation.

SSP Traffic Rural Jammu FarooqQaiser has urged the public to remain vigilant and report any such illegal and dangerous driving practices that may endanger public safety. He assured that strict action will be taken against all violators

# Illegal sand dumpers seized state times news

AKHNOOR: In a significant enforcement move, District Mineral Officer (DMO) Naveen Kumar and his team seized multiple illegal sand-laden dumpers that were coming from the Pargwal area and were intercepted near Khugga Morh (TCP No. 4). The swift action by the DMO's team has been widely appreciated for its firm stand against illegal mining and unauthorized transportation of sand.

## Drive against traffic violations launched

## Vehicles not transferred after sale-purchase seized

AWANTIPORA: Police in Awantipora have intensified vehicle checking across the police district as part of an enforcement drive targeting vehicles operating without mandatory transfer of ownership after sale/purchase.

Checking teams were deployed at multiple locations, during which several vehicles found without proper documentation, without updated ownership records, or involved in rash driving were seized. Necessary proceedings under the Motor

Vehicles Act have been initiated.

J&K Police urges all vehicle owners to promptly complete transfer-of-ownership formalities, avoid rash driving, and ensure all vehicle documents are kept up to date. Similar enforcement drives will continue in the coming days.

## Police take legal action against 144 vehicles for ownership violations

SHOPIAN: In a week-long enforcement drive against traffic violations, J&K Police in Shopian took legal action against 144 vehicles bearing registration numbers of other states, found plying on roads without mandatory transfer of ownership after sale-purchase.

Special police teams were deployed across multiple locations to identify such vehicles. During the drive, several vehicles operating without proper transfer of ownership and without mandatory re-registration were found in violation, and action under the relevant provisions of the Motor Vehicles Act has been initiated, including for non-registration and failure to transfer ownership. ## 11 vehicles including 6 dumpers seized for illegal mining

During routine checking, police teams intercepted the vehicles and detected unauthorized extraction and movement of minerals. All three vehicles were seized on the spot, and the Mining Department has been informed for further legal action

as per law. Kathua Police also seized a total of 02 vehicles i.e (02 Tractor alongwith Trolleys ) in the jurisdictional area of P/S Billawar which were being used for illegal mining/transportation of the construction material (Without A Form).
