ARTO disqualifies 12 DLs, suspends 7 RCs; recovers Rs 89,500 fine

RAJOURI: Under the directions of Transport Commissioner J&K, Vishesh Paul Mahajan and Deputy Commissioner Rajouri, Abhishek Sharma, Assistant Regiona Transport Officer (ARTO), Rajesh Gupta has initiated a stringent enforcement action against traffic violators and criminal offences involving Vehicles.

As part of the drive, eight driving licences (DLs) were disqualified for involvement in NDPS Act cases on the recommendations of the Police. Additionally, four driving licences were disqualified in fatal accident cases, reflecting the administration's zero-tolerance approach towards reckless and unlawful driving.

Further, four registration certificates (RCs) were suspended for involvement in bovine smuggling cases on police recommendations, while three RCs were suspended for repeated violations of the Motor Vehicles Act.

He also urged vehicle owners and drivers to adhere strictly to the provisions of the Motor Vehicles Act to avoid penal action.

Three illegal brick kilns demolished
