

NEW DELHI: In a bid to streamline criminal trials, the Supreme Court issued a slew of directions to trial courts on Monday to enhance the legibility of verdicts in criminal matters.

A bench of Justices Vikram Nath and Sandeep Mehta said all trial courts dealing with criminal matters shall, at the conclusion of the judgment, incorporate tabulated charts summarising the details of the witnesses examined, documents exhibited and material objects produced and exhibited. Two arrested for attacking SI

JAMMU: Two persons were arrested on Monday, a day after a sub-inspector of the Jammu and Kashmir Police was injured in an attack by a group here, officials said.

Nitin Sub-Inspector Khajuria, posted at the Bakshi Nagar police station, was attacked on Sunday evening by four people travelling in a Thar.

The accused -- Rishab, Munna D, and two unidentified individuals -- attacked him with a sharp weapon and also brandished a pistol, a police spokesperson said, adding that Khajuria sustained injuries and was rushed to Government Medical College Hospital in Jammu.

Taking cognisance of the incident, a case was registered at Bakshi Nagar police station, and special teams were formed to apprehend

the accused, he said. Police teams traced two of the accused to the Nikki Tawi area. While on the run in the darkness in the

Recruitment fraud: 103 F&ES Deptt employees terminated

JAMMU: Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha on Monday ordered the termination of services of 103 employees in the Fire and Emergency Services (F&ES) Department after they were found to have been illegally appointed through a manipulated recruitment process five years ago.

The action followed the findings of an inquiry committee and subsequent investigation by the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) into alleged irregularities in the 2020 recruitment process of firemen and drivers in the department.

In an order issued by J&K Home Department

Principal Secretary Chandraker Bharti said the government constituted an committee on December 12, 2022 to examine allegations of irregulari-

Emergency Department in 2020.

"The Committee, after detailed examination, recommended a criminal investigation by the ACB into allegations of paper leakage, manipulation of results, and other issues. Pursuant to these findings, the ACB registered an FIR on January 2, 2025 and submitted a preliminary verification report on January 9, followed by letters on November 21 and November 28," the order

The ACB report established large-scale tampering in OMR sheets, fabricated scanned images of answer sheets, and illegal manipulation of merit lists, conclusively confirming manipulation of results in favour of 106 candidates who were awarded marks far in excess of what they actually secured,

Bharti said it has been established beyond doubt that the appointments of these 106 candidates were obtained fraudulently, through criminal means and result-manipulation, rendering their appointments void ab initio.

"The protection available to civil servants under Article 311(2) do not apply in cases where the appointment itself is illegal and where the foundation of employment is vitiated by fraud," the order said, citing past judgments by the High Court of J&K and Ladakh and the Supreme Court in separate

Out of the 106 identified illegal appointees, the order said the appointment of three candidates has been cancelled by the Director, F&ES, for not fulfilling the requisite formalities required

Policeman martyred, terrorist injured in Udhampur gunfight

UDHAMPUR: A policeman was martyred and a terrorist believed to be injured in a gunfight in a remote forest village in Udhampur district of Jammu and Kashmir on Monday evening, officials

The gunfight has stopped but the area has been put under tight security cordon and all escape routes have been plugged to neutralize the holed-up terrorists, the officials said

The encounter erupted at village Soan in Majalta area of the hilly district when security forces launched a search operation following information about the presence of three terrorists believed to be affiliated with Pakistan-based Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) outfit,



they said. Inspector General of Police, Jammu, Bhim Sen Tuti said the contact was established with the terrorists after police received precise input

"Joint team of Special Operations Group (SOG) of police along with Army and CRPF are on job," the officer

about them in the remote vil-

In another post, the IGP said "a very small SOG team engaged the terrorists! Combing of the forest has been impeded due to darkness and treacherous ter-

The officials said the encounter took place in the besieged village around 6 pm and continued for sometime, resulting in injuries

India and Jordan share common & clear stance against terrorism: PM tells King Abdullah II

AMMAN: India and Jordan share a common and clear stance against terrorism. Minister Narendra Modi said on Monday as he met King Abdullah II and discussed bilateral ties and exchanged perspectives on regional and global issues of mutual interest.

Modi, who arrived in Jordan on a two-day visit at the invitation of Abdullah II, was warmly welcomed by the king at the Husseiniya Palace, where they held a one-on-one meeting before the delegationlevel talks.

The two sides agreed to further deepen their partnership, especially in the fields of trade and investment, defence and security, counter-terrorism

energy, and tourism. Both leaders reaffirmed their united stand against ter-

Under your leadership, Jordan has sent a strong and strategic message to the world against terrorism, extremism, and radicalisation," Modi said, reaffirming India's support for efforts being made to achieve a durable peace in the region. Abdullah II conveyed strong support for India's fight against terrorism and condemned terrorism in all its
