87 teachers served notices, one suspended over MDM, Academic Lapses in Poonch

RAJOURI: In a firm move to enforce accountability and improve the quality of education and student welfare, the Chief Education Officer (CEO) Rajouri Mohammad Hafiz has served explanation notices to 87 Masters and Teachers and placed one teacher under suspension after conducting district-wide surprise inspection of

As per inspection reports, 14 schools were found providing substandard Mid-Day Meals not in conformity with the approved menu, raising serious concerns over students' nutritional well-being. In 10 schools, discrepancies were detected between actual student attendance and the data uploaded on the ARMs portal. The inspections further revealed misutilization School Infrastructure Fund (SIF) in 13 schools, while 9 schools had improperly utilized Samagra Shiksha grants. In another 9 schools, items shown as purchased were not physically available during inspection.

Additionally, 15 schools failed to maintain mandatory store stock registers, indicating serious financial and administrative lapses. On the academic front, 5 schools were found lacking proper checking of students' notebooks, while 13 schools exhibited poor academic performance. Moreover, 8 schools showed unsatisfactory facelifting and maintenance of school buildings despite the availability of funds. Taking a serious view of these lapses, the CEO Rajouri has directed the concerned 87 Masters and Teachers to submit their written explanations through their respective Drawing and Disbursing Officers (DDOs) within two days. Meanwhile, Khalil Ahmed, Teacher, MS Padhyara (Zone Peeri), has been placed under suspension for negligence and non-maintenance of Mid-Day Meal records. During the suspension period, he shall remain attached to HS Treru (Zone Moghla) and will be entitled to suspension allowance as per

CS assesses cyber security framework implementation across J&K Sets deadlines for asset inventorization and SDC augmentation

JAMMU: Chief Secretary, Atal Dulloo, on Friday chaired a high-level meeting to review the progress achieved under the Cyber Security Action Plan being implemented across the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir.

The meeting was attended by Administrative Secretaries of all departments, Inspector General of Police (Crime), Commissioners of Jammu and Municipal Corporations, Deputy Director General, NIC, Chief Executive Officer, JaKeGA, and other

senior officers concerned. At the outset, the Chief Secretary undertook a comprehensive review of the initiatives launched to strengthen the cyber security architecture of the UT. He assessed the status of decommissioning of redundant government websites and sought updates on the security audit of departmental portals, installation of Endpoint Detection and Response (EDR) and Unified Endpoint Management (UEM) solutions in the offices of Heads of Departments, besides other measures aimed at safeguarding government digital infrastructure against emerging cyber threats. The Chief Secretary also reviewed the progress of key projects, including augmentation of the State Data Centre (SDC), operationalization of a Mini Security Operations Centre (SOC). adoption of official government e-mail IDs by employees,

expansion of Government Drive

usage, and capacity-building initiatives undertaken to promote cyber hygiene across departments. Stressing the need for a holistic and robust protection mechanism for IT assets, the Chief Secretary directed that all concerned Drawing and Disbursing Officers (DDOs) to complete the inventorization of IT assets on the e-SAM portal within the next one month to strengthen monitoring and security of government assets. He further instructed the NIC to prepare a comprehensive action plan

the capacity of the State Data Centre and implementing additional cyber security measures to make the system foolproof across J&K. Earlier the IGP, Crime, Sujit Singh apprised the meeting about a comprehensive and in-depth assessment of cyber forensic capabilities at CICE, J&K. He added that the process involves a detailed examination of existing systems, emerging requirements and future-ready initiatives aimed at strengthening cyber forensic infrastructure across the UT. Singh further apprised that a structured three-phase

approach has been adopted for this purpose. The first phase focuses on a thorough evaluation of technical specifications and proposed tools required for the establishment of CICE and Cyber Police Stations.

The second phase involves

examination of these tools in the context of emerging cyber threats such as deep fakes, encrypted mobile communications and data breaches. The third phase entails comparative analysis and consultations regarding the latest tools available in the market. During the Secretary, meeting, Technology Information Department, Dr. Piyush Singla, gave detailed overview of the implementation of cyber security plan in J&K. He informed that the security audit of departmental websites has been completed, and 35 redundant websites have been decommissioned after due consulta-

tion with the concerned depart-
