Reviews winter preparedness ahead of predicted snowfall, precipitation in J&K CM prioritises timely clearing of roads; power, water, essentials' supply

SRINAGAR: Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Saturday chaired a high-level meeting to review the preparedness of the administration in the event of snowfall and likely precipitation spell predicted over the coming weekend.

The meeting focused on assessing the readiness of departments across both Kashmir and Jammu divisions and fine-tuning response mechanisms to ensure minimal disruption to public life.

Addressing the meeting, the Chief Minister observed that winter preparation plans in both divisions are largely on track but stressed that the real test lies in effective implementation on the

ground. He noted that while precipitation is expected this weekend, it may not be as widespread as later in the season, providing the administration with a valuable opportunity to refine and strengthen preparedness

"Winter preparedness plans are on pace, but the test of any plan is in its implementation. This expected weather spell gives us time to refine our preparations before the more severe conditions set in," the Chief Minister said. Highlighting the core

responsibilities of the government during winter, CM Omar Abdullah underlined the administration would primarily be judged on three critical parameters: timely road clearance, uninterrupted electricity

EOW files chargesheet against four accused in Rs 50 lakh land fraud case

JAMMU: The Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of Crime Branch Kashmir has filed a charge sheet before the Court of Chief Judicial Magistrate, Srinagar, against four accused individuals for their alleged involvement in a high-value land fraud case

The accused named in the charge sheet include Mohd Afzal Sheikh, son of Late Ghulam Qadir Sheikh of Gopalpora, Chadoora, Budgam; Mohd Sikander

Dar, son of Ghulam Mohd Dar of Chainabal Mirgund, Pattan, Baramulla; and Ali Mohd Dar, son of Mohd Ibrahim Dar of Chainabal Mirgund, Pattan. Baramulla. The fourth accused is currently under investigation.

According to EOW officials, the case dates back to September 2022, when the complainant was induced by the accused, acting as land brokers, along with the landowner, to purchase

ACB arrests Patwari for accepting Rs 25,000 bribe

JAMMU: The Jammu and Kashmir Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) on Saturday trapped and arrested Ashiq Hussain Shah, Patwari of Patwar Halqa Pinjura Pehlipora, Shopian, for demanding and accepting a bribe of Rs 25,000 for providing a favourable report in

a land-related matter. According to an official spokesperson of the ACB, the Bureau received a written complaint from a complainant alleging that he had

submitted an application at the Tehsil Office, Shopian, seeking equal distribution of ancestral property among his wife and sister-in-law, who are among four sisters entitled to the property. The application was submitted around three months ago and was subsequently forwarded by the concerned Tehsildar, Shopian, to the Patwari for necessary verification and report. "When the complainant approached the Patwari concerned
