JAMMU:BJP spokesperson Convener, International Affairs Gaurav Gupta on Sunday launched a scathing attack on the Bangladesh administration following the brutal lynching of Hindu man Dipu Chandra Das, calling the incident a "shocking collapse of law and order and a grave failure to protect minorities

In an uncompromising statement, Gaurav Gupta said the killing allegedly over fabricated accusations exposes the alarming rise of radicalism, religious hatred and mob justice in Bangladesh.

"The savage lynching of Dipu Chandra Das is not an isolated crime; it is proof that mob rule has replaced the rule of law in Bangladesh. Beating a man to death, tying his body to a tree and setting it on fire is

the behaviour of a lawless society, not a civilised state," Gupta said.

Gupta said the incident raises serious and unavoidable questions about the safety of minorities and Bangladesh, accusing Dhaka of failing in its fundamental duty to protect human life.

"The Government of Bangladesh must stop offering excuses and start delivering justice. Cosmetic arrests will not suffice. Exemplary punishment is

only response to such barbarity," Taking aim at what he

described as systemic intolerance, Gupta said attacks on Hindus and other minorities have become recurrent and predictable, pointing to a dangerous climate of impunity. "This lynching reflects a

larger, deeply disturbing pattern of targeting minorities. The continued silence and inaction of authorities only emboldens radical elements and erodes communal harmony," he

Emphasising India's firm stand, Gaurav Gupta said New Delhi will not ignore attacks on its citizens or the persecution of minorities in neighbouring countries. "India will not remain a mute spectator when Indians are killed and minorities are hunted down. The safety, dignity and rights of Indians abroad are non-negotiable, and Dhaka must take this message seriously," he said.

Gupta further called upon the international community to take note of the deteriorating human rights situation in Bangladesh, stressing that violence driven by religious hatred cannot be normalised or justified under any pretext.

Concluding his statement, Gaurav Gupta said, "Justice delayed or diluted is justice denied. Those responsible must be punished swiftly and publicly so that such heinous crimes are never repeated.

HC dismisses writ petition in Cricket Association dispute; Rules matter lacks public law element

Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh has dismissed a writ petition filed by Sanjay Saraf regarding a factional dispute within the Whites Cricket Club (WCC). The Court held that the matter is a private civil dispute and does not involve any public law element, making it unsuitable for judicial review under Article 226 of the Constitution of India.

The petitioner had challenged an order dated March 19, 2025, issued by the Ombudsman of the J&K Cricket Association (JKCA), which recognized a rival faction of the WCC for voting purposes in upcoming elections. Saraf sought to be recognized as the sole eligible representative of the club. Justice Rajesh Sekhri, delivering the judgment, emphasized that writ jurisdiction is only available

against bodies performing pub-Court of lie duties that affect of rights. The Court noted that the dispute was a "pure civil dispute" between two private and factions. Ombudsman's order had no direct link to any public function or obligation. The judgment also observed

that the petitioner had an alternative remedy by approaching the Electoral Officer under Section 40(c) of the JKCA Memorandum of Association. The respondents, JKCA and BCCI, were represented by a legal team led by Senior Advocate Rahul Pant. assisted by Advocates Rajat Gupta and Arif Sikandar.

The Court concluded that since no public law element was established, the writ petition was not maintainable and dismissed it along with all connected applications.
