

Megh Sabha raises concern over absence of SC Judges in J&K-Ladakh High Court

JAMMU: All Jammu & Kashmir Megh Sabha has expressed strong concern over the continued non-representation of Scheduled Caste (SC) community in the Jammu, Kashmir & Ladakh Common High Court, calling it a serious injustice and a violation of constitutional principles.

Speaking at Press confer-MeghSabha President Narinder Datt said that since the formation of the Common High Court, no judge from the SC community has been appointed at the High Court level. He said the issue has remained unresolved despite repeated demands and the availability of eligible SC officers.

Narinder Datt noted that the Megh Sabha appreciates the intervention of the Hon'ble Union Law Minister, who, through a letter dated November 5, 2024, directed the Hon'ble Chief Justice of the Jammu, Kashmir & Ladakh Common High Court to ensure due representation of SC candidates during the promotion of judges. He further pointed out that although the sanctioned strength of High Court judges was increased from 17 to 25 and two judges were promoted thereafter, no SC judge has been promoted so far.

He emphasized that sev-

eral competent and eligible Sessions Judges from the SC community are available but are being consistently overlooked, which defeats the spirit of social justice, equality, and constitutional safeguards.

The All Jammu & Kashmir Megh Sabha urged the authorities to take immediate corrective measures to ensure fair representation of the SC community in the High Court in accordance with constitutional values and Union Government direc-
