These services have been initiated under the visionary leadership of the Executive Director& CEO, Prof. (Dr.) Shakti Kumar Gupta, with the objective of providing stateof-the-art, minimally invasive urological treatment to patients within Jammu and the adjoining regions, thereby reducing the need for referrals to distant tertiary cen-

The procedures were performed by Dr. Yaser Rahman, Assistant Professor, Department of Urology, and assisted by Dr. Mohammad Yaseen, Senior Resident, The surgeries were conducted with the dedicated support of the Anaesthesia team, headed by Dr. Sunaina Gupta, along with Dr. Shruti Sharma and Dr. Sandeepika Dogra, ensuring optimal perioperative care and patient safety. Both procedures are minimally invasive endoscopic surgeries performed without any external incision. These techniques are associated with shorter hospital stays, reduced postoperative discomfort, faster recovery, and early resumption of normal daily activities, leading to improved patient outcomes and quality of life.

Highlighting the clinical significance of the newly introduced services, Dr. Yaser
