



ISRO's 'Bahubali' rocket places 6000 kg US communication sat into orbit

Success reinforces India's growing role in global commercial launch market: Modi

SRIHARIKOTA (ANDHRA PRADESH): In a historic Christmas eve mission. ISRO's "Bahubali" rocket on Wednesday successfully launched a 6,100 kg US communication satellite-- the heaviest by and Indian launcher, into the desired orbit, a feat described by the space agency as the season's gift to the country.

The BlueBird Block-2 satellite is part of a constellation of global Low Earth Orbit (LEO) mission to provide direct-to-mobile connectivity through satellite that would enable 4G and 5G voice and video calls, texts, streaming and data for everyone, everywhere at all times. The heaviest satellite to be launched from Indian soil was done so using the LVM3 rocket, ISRO said.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has congratulated ISRO, saying that the success of the heavy-lift LVM3



rocket also reinforced India's growing role in the global commercial launch market.

"A significant stride in India's space sector. The successful LVM3-M6 launch, placing the heaviest satellite ever launched from Indian soil, the spacecraft of USA, BlueBird Block-2, into its intended orbit, marks a proud milestone in India's space journey," PM Modi said in a post on X.

"It strengthens India's heavy-lift launch capability and reinforces our growing role in the global commercial launch market," the prime minister said.

PM Modi said the LVM3 launch was also reflective of efforts towards Aatmanirbhar Bharat and congratulated hardworking scientists and engineers



Bribing Ex-SP South: ACB files charge-sheet against businessman

JAMMU: The Jammu and Kashmir Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) on Tuesday produced a charge-sheet against Chander Shekhar Vohra, Proprietor of M/s Asian Associates, for allegedly offering bribe to the then Superintendent of Police, City South, Jammu, to seek undue favour.

An ACB official said that the charge-sheet in FIR No. 01/2024, registered under Section 8 of the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988, was filed before the Court of Judge, Anti-Corruption, Jammu, on December 24, 2025. The charge-sheet has been protigation, which established the allegations as proved, the official stated.

According to the ACB, the case was registered following a written complaint submitby $_{
m the}$ Superintendent of Police, City South, Jammu. The complaint alleged that Chander Shekhar Vohra approached her seeking undue favour for the extension of the exhibition-cumsale being held at Gole Market, Gandhi Nagar, The Jammu. accused allegedly attempted to influence the official by offering a bribe amount of Rs 30,000 for extending the exhibition date. Acting swiftly on the

"During the operation, the accused was caught redhanded inside the office of the Superintendent of Police, City South, while offering the bribe," the ACB official said. The bribe money of Rs 30,000 was recovered and seized on the spot in the presence of independent witnesses, he added. "We have zero tolerance towards corruption and will continue to take strict action against anyone attempting to misuse public office or influence officials through illegal means,' the official emphasized.


