Speaking about Mookerjee, Singh said he struggled relentessly to safeguard India's unity and integrity and even sacrificed his life in pursuit of this goal, particularly in the context of Jammu and Kashmir, which earlier enjoyed a special status under Article 370.

He said Mookerjee's resolve was fulfilled in independent India by Prime Minister Modi through the abrogation of Article 370.

Singh said the philosophical concepts of "Integral Humanism" and "Antyodaya" were articulated by Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya, adding that Modi has been consistently striving to build a strong, self-respecting and self-reliant India based on these ideas.

He said Upadhyaya believed that human happiness could not be measured by material wealth alone and emphasised dignity, self-respect, intellectual development and spiritual

He said the NDA government's commitment to the welfare of the poor under Modi's leadership draws inspiration from Upadhyaya, whose statue was unveiled at the site.

On Vajpayee, Singh said the former prime minister needs no introduction, adding that the people of the Lucknow parliamentary constituency shared a deep bond with him. He said Vajpayee's genial and witty nature was well known.

Singh said Vajpayee's contribution to Indian politics, society and culture was unparalleled and that under Modi's leadership, India is progressing rapidly along the same path towards new heights of development.

He claimed "inflation has fallen to below one per cent for the first time in independent India's history and the country is witnessing a growth rate of over eight per cent during Modi's

He said Modi has raised India's stature internationally and transformed global perceptions about the country. Earlier, India's voice on international platforms was not given due weight, but today, under Modi's leadership, the world listens attentively to what India has to say, he added.

Highlighting initiatives for villages, the poor and farmers, Singh said Modi has undertaken major steps for rural development. He alleged that irregularities were common under the earlier MGNREGA scheme and said the government has instead introduced a new legislation titled "Viksit Bharat-G Ram G", under which rural workers would now get employment for 125 days instead of 100, along with the creation of permanent infrastructure in villages

"It (natural farming) increases income, saves water, and relieves people from many diseases," he added.

lished two big cooperative institutions through the Ministry of Cooperation, which are doing the work of certification of natural farming produce, its testing in world-class and modern labs, packaging, marketing and export.

Shah said, "In the coming time, more than 400 laboratories across the country will provide certificates to the farmers, due to which their income will increase by almost one-and-a-half

It can guide many farmers and cowherds towards progress he said.

"There is also a cowshed here, and a complete range of natural farming methods based on cow dung has been developed. This approach, which generates incomes of up to Rs 1.25 lakh per acre of land, will certainly prove to be a great blessing for small farmers," he said.

Earlier, Shah visited the Basaman Mama Cow Project and described it as a "very good approach".

The vehicle used in the illegal transportation of bovines has also been seized.

Acting on information received from reliable sources, a Police team of Police Post Rajpura of PS Ghagwal intercepted a Tata Youdha load carrier bearing registration number JK21D-2417 near village chachwal for its checkng. During checking, three bovines were found inside the vehicle which were tied in a cruel manner and were being transported illegally without any valid permission. At about 0230 hours today, a naka party of PS Thathri deployed at Kalnai bridge intercepted a vehicle bearing Registration No. JK06B-1503 for checking. SMVDS Samiti protests in Jammu, warns of shutdown over medical college admissions

JAMMU: Several right-wing Hindu groups held a protest in Jammu on Thursday evening, demanding the shifting of Muslim students from the Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Institute of Medical Excellence and reservations for Hindu students.

They also warned of intensifying the agitation if their demands are not

The controversy began after admissions for the inaugural MBBS batch of 50 students were completed through the NEET merit list last month. This batch includes 42 Muslim candidates, mostly from Kashmir, seven Hindu students from Jammu and one Sikh candidate.

Protesters, including members of the Bar trade associations, Association, social organisations and religious bodies, gathered under the banner of the Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Sangharsh Samiti, a recentlyformed conglomeration of organisations. They held a demonstration

against the Shrine Board and the Jammu and Kashmir administration. Led by Samiti convener Colonel

Sukhvir Singh Mankotia, the protesters raised slogans against Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha, Shrine Board members and Chief Minister Omar Abdullah, and burnt an effigy of the LG, calling for what they described as the fulfilment of the Hindu com-

munity demands.

"If this decision is not changed immediately, the agitation will intensify. We are holding small protests and will move towards a complete shutdown of Jammu if the demands are not fulfilled. The government is pushing us towards a massive agitation like the 2008 land row," Colonel Mankotia told reporters.

He said devotees make offerings at the Mata Vaishno Devi shrine out of

faith and devotion. "To ensure proper management of these offerings and to facilitate the pilgrimage, the Shrine Board was

constituted in 1988. Its primary

responsibility is to ensure safety, accommodation and smooth darshan for millions of pilgrims every year,' he said.

Mankotia added that the Board's priorities should also include promotion of Sanatan Dharma, operation of gurukuls, establishment of gaushalas and preservation of ancient temples.

The Samiti leaders alleged that for nearly two decades, offerings made by devotees have been used for activities that fall under the purview of the government, including construction of hospitals, universities, medical and nursing colleges and roads.

They maintained that offerings at the shrine should be utilised "exclusively for religious and Sanatan Dharma-related activities".

During the protest, the Samiti warned the Shrine Board administration to resolve the admission issue immediately and make changes in the functioning of certain Board members.
