The project aims to replace old and damaged pipelines that have been causing water supply issues for residents for a long time.

The work was launched in the presence of senior PHE officials including XEn Tajender Pal Singh, AEE Shubham Singh Baloria and JE Vikas Manhas, along with BJP leaders and workers.

Yudhvir Sethi said, "For the last many days, residents of these wards were continuously demanding replacement of old and damaged PHE pipes. These pipelines had outlived their life and were the main reason behind frequent leakages and water shortages. Today, along with PHE officials, I have started the Rs 66 lakh project to lay new pipelines in Wards 16, 17 and 18 so that people get clean and uninterrupted drinking

He further stated that providing basic amenities like safe drinking water remains his top priority.

"This project will not only improve water supply but also reduce wastage and prevent contamination. Our aim is to ensure that every household receives pure and sufficient water without disruption," Sethi added.

The MLA also appreciated the PHE department for their technical support and timely execution of the work. He assured residents that the project would be completed within the stipulated time frame and would bring longterm relief to the people of the area. JAMMU: In a significant step towards efficient water management, the Project Management Unit (PMII) of the Modernization Command Area Development (MCAD) Scheme, also known as SAMRIDDHI today conducted an extensive inspection and public interaction programme at Patyari Cluster in Samba district.

The team, led by Pankaj Magotra, Director, Command Area Development (CAD) Jammu and comprising officials from the Central Water Commission and allied departments, assessed the water feasibility aspects. They engaged with the Water User Society members and community representatives to understand ground-level issues, gather feedback and ensure participatory planning for effective water resource manage-

The inspection aimed to strengthen the interdepartmental coordination and promote sustainable water utilization strategies for enhanced agricultural productivity in the

This ambitious irrigation project envisages covering an area of 401.3 ha spread across 7 villages with Ravi Main Canal as the source. These villages included Radial Muthi Kalan Muthi Khurd, Naran, Gangeeth, Patyari and Patyari Katlan of Block-Ghagwal in Samba district. The key features included a pressurized piped irrigation network, solar backup and SCADA/IoT automation. It envisages conversion from open canals to Pressurized Piped Irrigation Network (PPIN) with Pump house, primary-tertiary pipelines, valves, filtration and surge protection.

The project promises numerous benefits, including 75% water-use efficiency, 20-30% increase in crop productivity and reduced water and energy losses. It also empowers the farmers, promotes women empowerment and ensures long-term sustainability.

The initiative aligns with the vision of "Har Khet Ko Pani + Per Drop More Crop", making irrigation measurable, accountable and finan-
