JAMMU: Under the patronage of Chief Justice, High Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh(Patron-in-Chief, J&K Judicial Academy), Arun Palli and guidance of Governing Committee for J&K Judicial Academy, the 2 day orientation programme on "Protection of Children from Sexual Offences" (POCSO) Act, 2012, with reference to SAMVAD's Training Manual on "Essential Interventions and Skills for Working with Child Sexual Abuse - Introducing Mental Health and Legal Dimensions of Forensics" and National Judicial Academy's Training Module for Fast Track Special Courts, concluded on Sunday at the Convention Centre, Canal Road, Jammu.

Justice Javed Iqbal Wani, Judge, High Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh (Member, Governing Committee for J&K Judicial Academy) in his special address, emphasized that an

offence against a child is not merely a criminal act but a grave violation of trust and dignity. He stressed that justice in such cases must be humane, responsive and child-centric and that courtrooms should Chairperson and members of become spaces of trust, safety and the last hope of justice for child victims.

Justice Wani observed that the POCSO Act, 2012 was enacted to transform the manner in which child victims are treated by the justice system, with the best interests and dignity of the child remaining paramount at all stages. He further noted that rehabilitation and compensation are integral aspects of justice under the Act, concluding that every POCSO case is a test of sensitivity and every child a measure of our commitment to justice.

On day 2, the first technical "Effective Investigation Documentation in POCSO Cases" was delivered by Dr. K.P. Singh, Former Director

General of Police, Haryana.

He shared best practices in police investigation, duties of Investigating Officers under Sections 24 and 25 of the POCSO Act, proper documentation, use of technology and the importance of confidentiality, while highlighting common investigative langes that lead to acquittals.

The second session on "Trial Management in POCSO Challenges, Sensitivity & Case Law" was conducted by Dr. Humayun Rasheed Khan, Professor, National Judicial Academy, Bhopal. The session focused on child-friendly courtroom procedures, managing testimony of child witnesses, the role of Special Courts, recent judgments of the Supreme Court and High Courts, protection of vulnerable witnesses, and fast-track procedures as envisaged under the National Judicial Academy's training

The third session was addressed by Mandeep Reen, Advocate, High Court of J&K and Ladakh, on "Important

modules.

Provisions of the POSH Act and Rules" and the interplay between the POCSO Act and the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015. She emphasized on gender mainstreaming, workplace equality, the role of Internal Local Complaints Committees, and the prohibition of gender-stereotypical language, with reference to the handbook issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of

AJKPWA opposes 18 pc passenger fare hike, calls it unjust and anti-poor

JAMMU: The All J&K Passengers Association (AJKPWA) has opposed the recent 18 per cent hike in passenger fares, terming it unjustified, arbitrary and a direct assault on the already burdened common people of Jammu and Kashmir.

The association has demanded that the government immediately roll back the steep hike, stating that it amounts to cruelty towards poor and middle-class pas-

In a press statement issued here, AJKPWA President Pandit R.C. Sharma questioned the logic behind such a substantial increase in fares, especially when prices of petrol and diesel have not

witnessed any significant rise over the past several years.

He said the decision reflects a lack of sensitivity towards the economic hardships faced by the people of the Union Territory. Pt. Sharma expressed seri-

ous concern over the constitution of the fare hike committee, pointing out that it did not include any representative from the passengers' community. He described the committee as completely unbalanced and unjustified, stressing that the entire transport system exists to serve passengers and therefore their representation is essential in any decisionmaking process related to

He further stated that transport operators are granted permits to serve the public and not to exploit them in the name of fare hikes. According to him, transporters are already making reasonable financial progress under the existing fare structure, leaving no genuine justification for such a sharp increase

Highlighting the prevailing financial stress on the people of Jammu and Kashmir, the AJKPWA President urged the government to take a balanced, humane and peoplecentric decision. He suggested that even if a fare revision is considered unavoidable, it should not exceed 3 per cent, which he said would be more than sufficient under the current economic conditions.

Reiterating the association's long-standing commit-

ment to passenger welfare, Pt. Sharma appealed to the government to immediately withdraw the 18 per cent fare hike and convene a fresh meeting of the Fare Hike Committee. He also demanded that representatives of the All J&K Passengers' Welfare Association be included in the committee, noting that AJKPWA has been consis-

tently working for the rights

and interests of passengers

since 2014. The association warned that failure to address the genuine concerns of passengers could lead to widespread resentment and further hardship for the common man, and urged the administration to act swiftly in the larger public interest.
