### Drug peddler arrested; 100 grams Charas recovered

DODA: Doda Police apprehended one more drug peddler and recovered a charaslike substance weighing approximately 100-110 grams from his possession.

A police party of Police Station Doda, led by SI Mushtag Ahmed, was performing routine naka duty at Gunpat Bridge, Pul Doda. During the naka, a motorcycle bearing registration number JK-02BE-7828, coming from Thathri towards Doda City, vas intercepted. On being signaled to stop, the rider attempted to evade the police party but was promptly apprehended.

During checking, a black-colored polythene bag was recovered from the possession of the accused, containing a charas-like substance weighing approximately 100-110

The accused has been identified as Shoket Ali, S/o Abdul Rehman, R/o Amrit Garh, Chiralla, Tehsil Chiralla, District Doda.

Accordingly, a case FIR No. 280/2025 under Sections 8/20 of the NDPS  $\operatorname{Act}$  has been registered at Police Station Doda, and further investigation has been taken up. # Udhampur Police attach worth Rs 21 cr illegal drug properties

UDHAMPUR: In a major crackdown under the provisions of the NDPS Act, Udhampur Police during the year 2025 has attached properties worth ?21 crore in 28 NDPS cases, belonging to hardcore drug smugglers operating across J&K.

The attached properties include 21 Residential houses along with land, 02 shops, 01 flat, 47 vehicles, and 04 savings bank accounts all identified as assets raised from the proceeds of narcotics smuggling.

The Investigating Officers, during sustained enquiries, established that these assets were acquired through the illegal drug trade and were accordingly attached under Section 68(F) of the NDPS Act, thereby disrupting the financial networks of narcotics traffickers

Notably, the highest single attachment during the year amounted to ?4 crore, wherein movable and immovable properties of narco-kingpin Majid Ali R/o Nagrota, Jammu were attached under the NDPS Act in connection with FIR Nos. 89 & 90/2025 of PS Majalta, marking a significant blow to organized drug syndicates.

Reinforcing zero tolerance, Udhampur Police, along with the District Administration, demolished illegally raised drug properties worth crores of notorious peddler Makhan Din at Narsoo, Chenani.

## **Doda Police secure conviction** under preventive provisions
