DC Kishtwar reviews progress of works under District CAPEX Budget 2025-26

KISHTWAR: Deputy Commissioner (DC) Kishtwar Pankaj Kumar Sharma today chaired a comprehensive review meeting to assess the progress of developmental works being executed under the District Capex Budget 2025-26.



At the outset, the DC reviewed in detailed the ongoing works as well as the projects allotted in the current financial year. He emphasized the need to accelerate the pace of execution to ensure timely physical and financial completion of all developmental initiatives. The DC issued strict directions to all line departments to expedite their activities and avoid any delays. Stressing the importance of optimal utilization of the limited working season, the DC directed all departments to immediately start all pending allotted works.

The Executive Engineers were directed to submit 100% bills of completed works and 70-80% bills of new works in the treasuries in the current month itself. It was further instructed that the salaries of the concerned DDOs will be withheld in case of non-compliance with these timelines. The CPO was directed to share a complete list of all works with the SDMs so that they can physically verify the projects and submit weekly progress reports to the office.

He was also instructed to share a Google Sheet with the concerned officers and dealing assistants, incorporating details such as actual expenditure, bills submitted in treasuries and pending or uncleared bills, so that the matter may be taken up with the Finance Department for timely clearance. The meeting was attended by CPO Akhil Thakur; ACD Manoj Kumar; EO MC, Mirza Mumtaz Iqbal, CEO Sanjay Dogra, Executive Engineers and other concerned.

Kathua Admin finalises arrangements for National Immunization Day

KATHUA: Deputy Commissioner Kathua Rajesh Sharma today chaired a meeting of the District Task Force to review preparedness for the National Immunization Day (Pulse Polio) scheduled on 21 December 2025. It was informed that the district has a target of 92,238 children (0-5 years), for which 580 vaccination booths will be established across 5 blocks. A total of 2,320 booth team members, 115 supervisors, 16 transit teams, 9 mobile teams and 35 vaccine delivery points have been mobilized to ensure smooth conduct of the drive. The district has

mapped 112 high-risk areas including slums, brick kilns, nomadic clusters, industrial zones and stone crusher sites. Transit vaccination points identified include Lakhampur, Atal Setu Basohli, Mashka Basohli and major railway stations at Kathua, Budli, Dayalchak and Hiranagar. Workforce deployment includes 594 ICDS workers, 783 Health staff, 12 from Education, 747 ASHAs and 184 local volunteers. It was given out that booth-level vaccination will be held on 21 December at designated centres, while house-to-house coverage will be carried out on 22 and 23

December across all blocks. The Deputy Commissioner directed all stakeholders to ensure 100 percent vaccination of the target population with special focus on high-risk habitations and transit points. He called for close coordination, timely logistics, and real-time monitoring so that no child is left uncovered during the Pulse Polio campaign. ADDC Kathua Surinder Mohan Sharma, PO ICDS Mohd Syed Khan, CMO Kathua Dr Vijay Raina, Dy CMO, District Immunization Officer, DHO and officers from ICDS, Education, Social Welfare and other stakeholder departments were also present.

Bangladeshi woman booked for illegal stay

RAMBAN/JAMMU: Police have registered a case against a Bangladeshi woman in Jammu and Kashmir's Ramban district on Saturday for illegally entering and staying in India in violation of immigration laws, officials said. Happu Akhter, a resident of the Habiganj district of Bangladesh, was booked after police received reliable information about her presence in the Kunfer area of Chanderkote, a police spokesperson said. He said Akhter had unlawfully entered India without possessing a valid passport or visa. During verification, it was found that the woman had been residing in the Kunfer area for a few days, the spokesperson said, adding that a preliminary enquiry revealed that she had been attempting to conceal her identity, raising "serious suspicion" regarding the purpose of her presence in the area. Based on the findings, a case under relevant provisions of the Immigration and Foreigners Act has been registered at the Chanderkote police station, and further investigation is underway, he said. The official appealed to the general public to remain vigilant and refrain from providing shelter, accommodation, or assistance to any illegal foreign national. "People are also advised not to enter into any form of contract or marriage with such individuals without verifying their legal status, as doing so may attract legal consequences," he said. He said police remain committed to maintaining internal security and ensuring the strict enforcement of immigration laws across the district.

Police recover banned literature during search in Pulwama

SRINAGAR: Police on Saturday recovered incriminating material, including posters of a separatist outfit and some banned literature, during a search in Jammu and Kashmir's Pulwama district. Acting on a search warrant issued by the NIA Court Pulwama in a case registered under the UAP Act, the police carried out a search at a shop belonging to Mohamed Amir Rather, a resident of Litter Pulwama, a police spokesman said. According to the spokesperson, the search operation was conducted in the presence of a magistrate and independent witnesses to ensure complete transparency and due process. During the search, police recovered incriminating material, including posters of the Jammu and Kashmir Democratic Freedom Party (JKDFP) headed by the incarcerated Shabir Shah and banned literature books from the premises of the accused, the spokesman said. He added that all the seized items have been taken into custody for detailed scrutiny. Further investigation is in progress to ascertain the broader dimensions of the case and verify any additional connections linked to the seized material, he added.

ASI booked in Doda for 'assaulting' two-wheeler rider in full public view

"On December 3, a written complaint was lodged at the DH Doda police post by Anzar Majid Malik, alleging that ASI Ghulam Ali, a resident of Sadeeqabad, wrongfully restrained and assaulted him. "Acting promptly on the complaint, an FIR under relevant sections of law was registered at the Doda police station, and an investigation was initiated," police said in a statement. "Upholding its zero-tolerance policy towards any misconduct within the force, police have set the due legal process into motion. Further investigation in the case is underway," it said.

2 missing women traced, reunited with families
