

JKSAC flays Admn’s order on closure of one-time settlement scheme

R S PURA: Jammu Kashmir Sharnarhi Action Committee (JKSAC) in a meeting held at village Manna, Tehsil R.S. Pura strongly condemned the relief administration of UT govt. for issuing notifications No. DIP/J-12310/21 dated 28-01-2022 appeared for closure of the One-time settlement scheme in respect of DP's of 1947 from POK 1965 & 1971. The participants in the meeting termed this notification as arbitrary, illogical and mischievous. The notification has been issued with a clear intention to defame the Modi govt. in the eyes of various categories of DP's who have been provided a relief package of Rs 5.5 lakhs each DP family for the first time in seven decades.

Addressing the meeting of executive body of Sub-dis-

trict RS Pura at village Manna, Gurdev Singh President alongwith Bagwan Singh, Capt. Puran Singh Chib, Suram Singh Chib, Tarlok Singh Tara and Dwarka Nath Khajuria said that the govt. has been approached right from Divisional Commissioner to Chief Secy. of UT of J&K since 2019 to extend the scheme to accommodate thousands of left-out families for want of mandatory

records, essential to establish the status of DP's. Such record is either dilapidated, torn/missing due to decades of absolute negligence of concerned relief administration. He particularly condemned the Special Secy. DMRRR to say that entire number of families of POJK have been covered under the scheme. The statement made in the notification is totally false, misleading and away from the truth. He said

that ex-gratia relief of Rs 5.5 lakhs was provided to 36,384 DP's families including 26,319 families from POK and 10,065 of 1965 and 1971 wars. He said that out 26,319 families from POK settled in UT of J&K, relief has been disbursed only to approx. 20,000 families and about 1,000 cases are still pending disbursement process including disputed cases. He further said out of 26,319 DP's families from POK, the mandatory records of 4,000 families required for seeking relief is either dilapidated, torn or missing due to entire negligence of relief administration from time to time responsible to keep the record intact and in living conditions. The DP's cannot be punished for such historical negligence of the administration. He said

despite of recent clear directions given by Home Minister, Amit Shah to UT govt., to ensure benefit of ex-gratia relief package to all the bonafide DP's of POK even including those who left in 1947 to other parts of the country. He said that govt. of UT of J&K must take the notice of this notification issued by the Spl. Secy. DMRRR which is quite contrary to Modi's govt. policies and honest will to resolve the long pending DP's settlement issues. He made an appeal to the administration to withdraw this mischievous/illogical notification immediately otherwise DP's would be left with no option except to sit on dharna on 9th Feb. 2022 outside the Governor House to apprise the Lt. Governor about this notification and its repercussions.
