

LG launches QR code-based mechanism for certification, labeling of handmade carpets of J&K

JAMMU: Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha on Thursday launched QR Code based mechanism, which is first of its kind in the country, for certification and labeling of handmade carpets of J&K.

With the QR-based application, customers can check & verify authenticity and other requisite details of carpets produced in Jammu Kashmir UT.

The Lt Governor observed that J&K Handicrafts are repository of India's creative traditions that is serving as a cultural expression for centuries. This creative tradition is strikingly visible in handmade carpets with intricate designs & subtle shades.

With the help of modern technology, we will be able to standardize uniqueness of handmade carpets & boost exports of J&K's carpet industry in the international market, he added. On the occasion, the Lt Governor also felicitated UT's awardees of Handicrafts & Handloom. "I truly admire the painstaking work of all the craftsmen and carpet weavers. Government is providing training & financial support to strengthen the priceless artistic and cultural heritage of J&K UT", he said.

The Lt Governor said that J&K has a unique identity in the global market for handloom and handicraft products. He noted that the Indian Institute of Carpet Technology has taken several important steps for GI certification, testing, labeling and training to promote Kashmiri carpets.

"Government of Jammu and Kashmir has introduced Export Incentive Scheme. Under this scheme, incentive of 10% of the total volume of GI certified Handicrafts and Handloom products exported to any country, with maximum reimbursement upto Rs. 5 crores, shall be provided to eligible exporters registered with Department of Handicrafts and Handloom", he added.

The Department of Handicrafts & Handloom and Indian Institute of Carpet

Technology (IICIT), Srinagar shall launch a massive awareness & promotional campaign within and outside the UT to popularize GI of Hand-knotted carpets so that its demand gains popularity across the globe, the Lt Governor said.

It was informed that a project has also been completed in association with NIFT Srinagar. The Lt Governor further observed that presently carpets are being exported from Jammu and Kashmir to at least 25 countries. In 2020-21, carpets worth Rs 115 crore were exported to Germany, Rs 34 crore worth to USA, Rs 36 Crore to UAE and Rs 22 crore to Netherlands.


Earlier, Ranjan Prakash Thakur, Principal Secretary to J&K Government, Industries & Commerce Department briefed the chair about the key

Curtains down on rehabilitation package for PoJK DPs, several families still craving for justice

► More than 50 per cent displaced families denied justice

JAMMU: The Government on Thursday downed the curtains on the much publicized scheme for rehabilitation package of Pakistani occupied Jammu and Kashmir (PoJK) Displaced Persons (DPs) of 1947 and Chhamb DPs of 1965 and 1971 through which thousands of displaced families received Rs 5.5 lakh each although a considerable number of families were denied the relief, as these failed to produce the requisite documents and formalities to prove authenticity. The aforesaid scheme was given nod in 2016 by the Prime Minister Narendra Modi during the first stint of his government as things started rolling soon after BJP came to power in the year 2014. Those refugee families which produced the prerequisite documentation were given Rs 5.5 lakh by transferring the same into the bank accounts thus making the procedure transparent and hassle-free.

About 31,619 families were migrated from PoJK to J&K in 1947. Out of these, 26,319 families settled in J&K and 5,300 families initially moved to other parts of the country. During 1965 and 1971 Indo-Pak wars, 10,065 more families were displaced from Chhamb-Niabat area in which 3,500 families were displaced during 1965 war and 6,565 families were displaced during the 1971 war.

A total of 36,384 displaced families covered under the rehabilitation package approved by the Cabinet on 30.11.2016 included 26,319 displaced families from PoJK settled in J&K and 10,065 Displaced Families displaced from Chhamb Niabat area. While 5,300 displaced families of PoJK who initially moved

tained after 10th of February 2022, if no claim is received before the due date. "It shall be presumed that there is no claimant left in respect of DPs/WPR families settled in District Jammu", the notice further reads.

Ch Manmohan Singh, President All India Jat Maha Sabha and former Mayor Jammu, said that the abrupt closure of rehabilitation package scheme for PoJK Displaced Persons a cruel joke with those refugees who have not received the stipulated Rs 5.5 lakh relief for delay in documentation. "There is no logic in abruptly closing the aforesaid scheme because still hundreds of families are lurking to get the benefit guaranteed by none other than the Prime Minister of the country," he said and demanded that aforesaid scheme should be extended for another six months and a procedure should be relaxed so that the genuine and deserving DP families would get their claim.

Ravinder Sharma, former MLC and Chief Spokesperson Jammu and Kashmir Pradesh Congress said that BJP Government at the Centre has betrayed the refugees of 1947, 1965 and 1971. He urged the LG to immediate review and recall recent notice of closing the relief package scheme. He requested for continuation of ongoing disbursement process of Rs 5.5 lakh till all the eligible families are covered. Despite repeated attempts, Suraj Parkash Rukwai, Special Secretary, Department of Disaster Management, Relief, Rehabilitation and Reconstruction, having additional charge of ex-officio PRO, Jammu, could not be contacted for comments as his phone was switched-off.
