Complete selection process of jobs advertised prior to Reorganisation Act: Abhinav

JAMMU: Alleging that annulling the posts advertised before introduction of Reorganisation Act on October 31, 2019 is discriminatory, Advocate Abhinav Sharma, Spokesperson BJP J&K said that vacancies advertised before the aforesaid date were out of purview of amended reservation rules and the Domicile Concept which was introduced by amending J&K Decentralization Act and Rules 2010 and therefore government should complete the selection process as per earlier rules to ensure justice to J&K youths.

BJP Spokesperson Abhinav Sharma accompanied by Spokesperson Dr. Tahir Choudhary and Media Secretary Dr. Pardeep Mahotra said this while addressing a press conference at party headquarter, here on Sunday.

Making a fervent appeal to

LG Manoj Sinha, Abhinav urged the head of the Union Territory to intervene and ensure justice to the educated unemployed youths of the region.

Talking about J&K Police Border Battalion aspirants, Adv. Sharma said that the

district-wise posts were advertised prior to introduction of Reorganisation Act as well as Domicile Act and the applications were invited on the basis of State Subject.

"The physical tests were also conducted prior to October 31, 2019 and the

recruitment was to be made on the basis of reservation rules in vogue before October 31, 2019. The move to annul the posts advertised before October 31, 2019 has led to sheer injustice with the aforesaid aspirants because with fresh advertisements, the new reservation rules and Domicile Act will come under purview thus denying the fair deal to the aspirants", Adv. Sharma said, adding that to deliver justice to Border Battalion aspirants and also those who have applied for the

gazetted and non-gazetted vacancies in J&K it is necessary to complete the selection process of jobs advertised before October 31, 2019.

Advocate Abhinav Sharma mentioned that General Administration Department (GAD) of Jammu and Kashmir has withdrawn all posts including gazetted and non-gazetted referred to JKPS/ JKSSB prior to 31-10-2019, for which selections have not been finalized till date, as also the posts in which there are litigations and the cases are pending in the Court.

J&K BJP Spokesperson urged the LG Sinha to intervene and ensure justice to the local youths of J&K as the order directing cancellation of all posts advertised before October 31, 2019 is discriminatory and needs to be rescinded as soon as possible to put an end to prejudice and clear ambiguity once and for all.

LEH: The Lieutenant Governor of Ladakh, RK Mathur, on Sunday met with Chairman, Agricultural and Processed Food Products Export Development Authority (APEDA), Dr M Angamuthu; Director General (DG) of Border Roads Organisation (BRO), Lt Gen Rajeev Chaudhary, and Chief Operating Officer (COO), National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC), Ved Manu Tiwari, in New Delhi, to discuss issues about Ladakh.

LG Mathur discussed various topics with the Chairman of APEDA, Dr Angamuthu, including exploring other countries where apricots and other horticulture/agriculture products from Ladakh can be exported; establishing APEDA's sub-office at Kargil, organic certification for declaring Ladakh as an organic state and declaring sea buckthorn as organic; tying up with APEDA for international buyers-sellers meet and their assistance as technology partners for the Food Processing Conclave to be held in Ladakh; extending Pack House scheme for export of fresh fruits, developing packaging standards for highly perishable and potential products such as apricot through Indian Institute of Packaging; providing capacity-building trainings and programmes on various food processing methods and extension of reefer vans scheme to

Leh/Zanskar instead of Manali for better monitoring and execution of Nimoo-Padum-Darcha road, the status of widening of Leh-Manali road and tunnels on the passes and status of new connectivity to Himachal Pradesh on the Korzok-Spitit axis.

LG Mathur spoke to COO NSDC Ved Manu Tiwari about skill development related issues and developments, viz. the constitution of Ladakh Skill Development Mission (LSDM), assigning a nodal officer from NSDC in Ladakh, the proposal submitted by NSDC to conduct Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) in Ladakh, the completion of the proposed skill gap study through NSDC at the earliest, assigning a State Engagement Officer (SEO) of NSDC in Ladakh and identifying and implementing agency for executing skill trainings by NSDC, etc.
