JAMMU: Acknowledging the importance of mental health, especially in the post Covid 19 pandemic scenario, more than 1000 Government schools of Jammu Division have created Happiness zones to provide safe and psychologically comfortable spaces within the school premises where students can talk about their feelings and emotions unhesitatingly and in a confidential manner.

These Zones are created as per directions of the Ministry of Education endorsed by Administrative Department School Education.

More such zones will be created in winter zone schools as the schools reopen after vacations.

In a first of its kind initiative, Directorate of School Education Jammu on Tuesday directed all the Schools of Jammu Division from Middle to Higher secondary to create such happiness zones to provide psychosocial support to students as per Manodarpan guidelines. Trained Faculty Counsellors working in Counselling Cells of these schools are rendering their services in these zones.

Manodarpan is an initiative of the Ministry of Education (MOE) Government of India (GOI) aims to provide psychosocial support and counselling to students for their mental health and well-being during the Covid 19 outbreak and beyond. The Covid pandemic is not only a serious medical concern but also brings mixed emotions and psycho-social stress for all.

Counselling cell DSEJ is organizing regular capacity development programmes, webinars for Teachers in collaboration with reliable institutions like Nimhans Bangalore, Department of ICPs, BCPA, Department of Psychiatry GMCs to develop coun-

selling skills in teachers. Principal Secretary School Education Department B.K. Singh has emphasised creating a stress free atmosphere in schools. He recently visited a few of such happiness zones and enquired in detail about the counselling services being provided in schools.

Dr. Ravi Shankar Sharma, Director of School Education Jammu stated that students coming to schools after such a long gap may experience a heightened level of stress, anxiety, and fearfulness along with a wide range of other emotional and behavioural issues due to COVID situation. We need to be prepared to offer students a healthy and psychologically safe environment to safeguard them. Happiness of the child is directly linked with academic outcomes and to improve attention, retention of students we have to ensure mental health, safety and security

of students.

Dr. Romesh Kumar Sharma, in charge Counselling cell said that constitution of happiness Zones in schools will create a culture of individualized guidance and counselling in schools. He added that creation of Happiness zones in schools will go a long way in

Pertinently, Directorate of School Education Jammu through its Counselling Cell has undertaken a lot of initiatives for mental health and well-being of the students.

# Kohli set for 100th Test in Mohali day-nighter in Bengaluru

NEW DELHI: The BCCI on Tuesday announced a revised itinerary for the home series against Sri Lanka, beginning February 25, confirming that the Twenty20 series will be played before the two Tests.

Originally, the two-Test series was planned before the T20s but the BCCI has made the change following a request from Sri Lanka Cricket.

"Sri Lanka will first play the T20I series comprising three matches followed by a two-match Test series, which will be part of the ICC World Test Championship, 2021-23," said the BCCI in a statement.

It was widely reported that the T20s against the



Lankan side will take place before Test matches in Mohali and Bengaluru and the cricket body has now confirmed it.

Virat Kohli is expected to play his 100th game in Mohali from March 4-8.

The second Test will be played in Bengaluru from February 12-16 and will be a day-night affair. The last

Test will be played in Ahmedabad last, ended inside two days with England crumbling on a rank turner.

The first T20 will be played in Lucknow on February 25 before the teams travel up the hills to Dharmsala for second and third game on February 26 and 27.

With the schedule announced for Sri Lanka series, the BCCI is expected to name the Test captain, a post which was left vacant in the wake of Kohli's unexpected resignation a day after India lost the Test series in South Africa.

Kohli ended his tenure as India's most successful Test captain with 40 wins, 11 draws and 17 losses in 68 Tests.
