

## Director Agriculture reviews functioning of IIKSTC; holds interaction with NABL team

SRINAGAR: The Director Agriculture Kashmir, Chowdhary Mohammad Iqbal on Wednesday reviewed the functioning of India International Kashmir Saffron Trade Centre (IIK-STC) Dussoo, Pampore.

The Director also visited different sections of the trade centre and was briefed by the concerned officers regarding the functioning of different units (including packing, labelling, grading and e-auctioning unit) of the IIKSTC.

Speaking on the occasion, The Director said that the centre must adopt the latest trends regarding the quality control and marketing of saffron. He asked the concerned officer to take feedback from

the saffron growers and make all the efforts to ensure that their interests are safeguarded.

Iqbal said that e-auctioning facility at the centre created by the department aims at providing platform to the buyers to have access to quality "Kashmir Saffron" and help saffron viewers for getting optimum returns of their yield which will ultimately boost the economy of the saffron growers without the interference of intermediaries.

He further added that the saffron purchased through this platform is tested/certified quality produce.

Iqbal said that the department is eyeing new markets at national and international

level in future with respect to the marketing of saffron therefore, new marketing channels need to be explored.

Later, the Director held an interactive session with the team of National Accreditation Board for testing and calibration laboratories led by NABL Assessor S.C. JOSHI. Director expressed his views regarding the functioning of IIK-STC to the visiting team. He further discussed various initiatives taken by the trade centre for the development of the saffron sector.

During the visit, the Director was accompanied by administrator IIKSTC Shah Nawaz Ahmad Shah and some senior officers of the department.

## Tourism Deptt, KU launch capacity building programme for stakeholders

This is the first of a series of capacity building programmes being organized jointly by the Tourism Department and Kashmir University for skill enhancement of tourism stakeholders at various destinations across Kashmir.

## DC Anantnag convenes TB Forum meeting

ANANTNAG: The Deputy Commissioner (DC) Anantnag, Dr Piyush Singla on Wednesday chaired the TB forum meeting at DC Office, here.

The TB forum is a platform with representatives from District Administration, Health, PRI members, Journalists, Advocates and members of the civil society and is aimed to supplement and complement government initiatives for eradication of tuberculosis by 2025 and reduce stigma associated with TB.

Speaking on the occasion, the DC said that the health department should shift to an active approach to eliminate TB from the district. He said aggressive campaigning must be carried out to ensure maximum coverage and reduce the stigma associated with TB in the society.

He said that the incentive policy for identifying TB cases where Rs 1000 is given

to private practitioners for notifying TB cases must be widely publicized.

Regarding the sub-national certification to be started in the district by Saturday to assess the present extent of TB eradication, the DC agreed to augment survey remuneration to surveyors by Equivalent amount from their own resources. This was done to have quality service in the district.

Dr Singla lauded the DTO and his team for the work carried out so far and said that dedicated efforts have to be made to eradicate TB.

He said the focus should be on educating people particularly the high risk group that can contract TB due to other comorbidities.

Earlier, the DTO presented the achievements of the district so far. He said that the DTC center caters to Anantnag and Kulgam through 12 treatment units, 16 DMCs and 361 DOT Centres.

He said that under universal drug susceptibility testing, out of 690 patients, 627 have been tested so far. Similarly under HIV diabetes testing 100 percent of

the patients have been tested. Under Nikshay Poshan Yojana, an amount of Rs 15.79 lacs has been disbursed which covers 95 percent of the eligible cases and the remaining cases are under process.

The District Tuberculosis Center has also provided treatment support honorarium of Rs 16000 to 12 patients.

The participants were informed that the district will commence the Sub National Certification from Saturday whereby a cluster based survey will be carried out in the district. A 30 member survey team will conduct the survey in 15 clusters to assess the present TB scenario in the district.

The meeting was attended by ADDC, CMO, HoD Medicine GMC Srinagar, MS GMC Anantnag, and representatives from WHO, PRI members, representatives from media and NGOs among others.

The Chairman visited Govt Polytechnic College at Larkipora where a plantation drive was organized by the Social Forestry Division, Anantnag. He said that under the ambit of Har Ghar Hariyali initiative of the government, plantations have been carried out throughout the district and he is hopeful that the initiative will augment the green cover in the district. He appealed to people to plant saplings in their surroundings.

The Chairman also paid obeisance at Ziyarat Sharief Kabamarg, Hazrat Anantnag.

He prayed for the overall development of the district. He also took stock of the facilities being extended to the devotees at the facility.

Gorsi visited Block Shahabad Dooru and interacted with the PRI members. He took stock of the development works being undertaken under District CAPEX, MGNREGA and 14th FC. He impressed upon the PRIs and officials to ensure works are completed as per the timeline. He said that the development plan for the next year has been formulated under MGNREGA and emphasized that priority must be given to works of public importance. The Weekly Block Divas programme was held within the premises of Boys High School, Panzinara which witnessed large participation of people from Panzinara-A, Panzinara-B and other adjoining areas of Shalteng Tehsil of Srinagar District. During the Grievance Redressal Camp, local DDC members, PRI representatives, Public delegations and scores of individuals projected various issues and demands before the DC particularly the long pending issue arising out of jurisdictional dispute with Baramulla and Bandipora.

## CRIME REPORT

### Two narco-smugglers arrested with heroin, weapons

JAMMU: Police on Wednesday detained two narco-smugglers with 5 gm heroin along with weapons.

As per details, a team of Police Station Bahu Fort constituted under the supervision of SDPO East Syed Zaheer Abbas Jafari and led by SHO Police Station Bahu Fort Insp Nayat Ali during Naka near Bathindi Morh, rounded up two suspects in a vehicle (JK02CD 1822). The suspects were identified as Yashwant Pathania, son of Yudhvir Pathani, resident of Digiana and Pankaj Bhagat, son of Som Nath Bhagat, resident of Tej Mongor, Gali-1, Jalandhar (Punjab) at present Bari Brahmna, Samba. On search, 5 gm heroin, a magazine of pistol, 2 live cartridges and a Toka was recovered from them. During further questioning, one 12-bore double barrel rifle, one cartridge of 12-bore, 2 air-gun pistols and a sword were also recovered. Duo was arrested and FIR No. 51/22 under sections 8/21/25/29 of NDPS Act and 3/4/25 of Arms Act was registered against them at Police Station Bahu Fort. Jammu police is working intensively to uproot chains of drug supply in the region and thorough questioning of accused is going on to know origin of drugs supply chain.



### Two bootleggers arrested, 60 lts illicit Lahan destroyed

DODA: Police on Wednesday arrested two bootleggers and recovered illicit liquor besides destroying 60 lts Lahan.

Doda Police said that in two separate cases, FIRs were registered at Police Station Bhadarwah and Police Station Assar and 60 lts illicit Lahan was destroyed by a team from Police Station Gandoh Police. Two accused were also apprehended and illicit liquor was recovered from their possession which they were carrying for illegal sale in Bhalra, Assar and Changa areas. FIR No. 20/2022, under section 48 (b) & (c) of Excise Act was registered at Police Station Bhadarwah. A police team led by PSI Bhopinder Sharma Incharge Police Post Bhalra apprehended one Vipon Kumar, son of Des Raj, resident of Himote Bhalra and recovered 15 lts Lahan and 2 lts liquor from him. The accused person was manufacturing and carrying illicit Liquor for selling purpose.

In another case FIR No. 03/2022, under section 48 (a) of Excise Act, a party led by Insp Bhovinder Singh, SHO Police Station Assar apprehended a bootlegger namely Rajinder Singh, son of Thakur Dass, resident of Babroo, Tehsil Assar at a Naka and recovered 13 bottles of JK Special Whisky from his possession which he was illegally carrying. Investigation of both cases is going on

Also, a party led by Gandoh Police raided houses of Mool Nath and Ghulab Singh and on see-



ing Police party, all family members fled away from the spot. Panch and other respectable people of same village were called on the spot and during search, 60 lts Lahan was recovered, which was destroyed on spot. All operations were done under the overall supervision of SSP Doda Abdul Qayoom and SDPO Bhadarwah Meer Gafoor, DySP DAR Shoket Ali.

### 4 drug peddlers arrested; contraband recovered

BARAMULLA: Continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drugs from society, Police in a series of actions has arrested four drug peddlers in Baramulla on Wednesday and recovered contraband substances from their possession.

As per details, Police in Baramulla at various checkpoints established across the district, arrested four drug peddlers identified as Shahnawaz Ahmad Shah, son of Gh Ahmad Shah, resident of Shah Mohalla Nihalpora; Amandeep Singh, son of Jagtar Singh, resident of Hoshiarpur (Punjab), Aqib Sheikh, son of Bashir Ahmad Sheikh, resident of Sheikh Mohalla & Sameer Ahmad Sheikh, son of Gulab Sheikh, resident of Hawal at present Waripora Kunzer and recovered 5 Kg Poppy Straw and 385 gm Charas from their possession.

Moreover, a vehicle (Maruti Ertiga) bearing registration No PB07BC-8625 being used by accused persons was also seized. All drug peddlers were shifted to police station where they remained in custody. Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law were registered in Police Station Pattan, Tangmarg & Kunzer.

### Trucker, accomplice nabbed with 13.912 Kg poppy straw

KATHUA: Kathua Police, continuing its 'War against Drugs' recovered approximately 13.912 Kg Poppy Straw (Bhukki) like narcotics near Galak Naka and arrested 2 persons in this connection.

As per details, on directions of SSP Kathua R C Kotwal, a police team led by PSI Ravinder Thakur Incharge Police Post Ramkot under supervision of SDPO Billawar Arvind Kumar during Naka checking duty at Galak noticed a suspicious Truck (PB10HJ-1635), which was signalled to stop for checking.

On thorough checking, approximately 13.912 Kg Poppy Straw (Bhukki) was recovered from the vehicle. The driver was identified as Jasvinder Singh, son of Yoga Singh, resident of Ward-5 Chanderlok, District Ludhiana while accomplice was identified as Ramesh, son of Prem Chand, resident of Ghoat, Tehsil Ramnagar. Duo was arrested and FIR No. 21/2022 under sections 8/15/29 of NDPS Act was registered at Police Station Billawar.

Meanwhile, locals of village Bamiyal, Nagrota intercepted a vehicle (JK20-4474) and during frisking found it laden with 3 bovies, which were rescued. Soon the villagers informed police and handed over driver, namely Ashiq Ali, son of Mohd Ali to police.

### Woman injured in head-on collision between vehicles
